[In addition to the normal historical backgrounds, the author includes chapters on how the LXX was collected and used in both Jewish circles as well as by the early Christian church].
- Jobes, Karen H. and Moisés Silva. *Invitation to the Septuagint*. Grand Rapids, MI: Baker Book House, 2000. [This is probably the best overall entry-level introduction to the study of the LXX and the problems to be encountered].

- Tov, Emanuel. *The Text-Critical Use of the Septuagint in Biblical Research*. Rev. 2nd ed. Jerusalem: Simor Ltd., 1997. [This is a much more advanced study of the LXX, with numerous examples of textual criticism involving the LXX mss].
