

Introduction

We have defined **Follow-up** as:

"That process of training which brings spiritual children to maturity in their walk with the Lord and in their service to the Body of Christ."



Many of us know Christians who have made genuine professions of faith, but have never grown in the Christian life. Time has passed years and sometimes decades—but they are as much spiritual infants today as they were when they came to Christ.

Why didn't they grow?

Why do some Christians go on to maturity while others do not?

These are not easy questions to answer. In every situation the reason would differ with the individual. However, we must recognize that there are certain basic needs which every new believer has, and we must labor to see that these needs are met. As we are faithful to provide these things for new Christians, we will see more and more people begin to grow and fewer fall by the wayside. While fewer will fall, we must always remember that God's objective for every Christian is that they "arrive at real maturity—the measure of development which is meant by the 'fullness of Christ.'"

What are the basic elements necessary in "the care and feeding" of young Christians? Let us examine them briefly.

Ensure Proper Parental Care

In the last session we saw the way that God provided spiritual helpers or *parents* for both Paul and Cornelius. God provided Ananias for Paul and Peter for Cornelius. These spiritual fathers spent time with their new babes in Christ to ensure that they would begin to grow spiritually.

The Bible shows Ananias as Paul's spiritual father like this:

And Ananias went his way and entered the house; and laying his hands on him he said, "Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus, who appeared to you on the road as you came, has sent me that you may receive your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit." Immediately there fell from his eyes something like scales, and he received his sight at once; and he arose and was baptized. And when he had received food, he was strengthened. Then Saul spent some days with the disciples at Damascus.

Acts 9:17-19

The Bible shows Peter as Cornelius' spiritual father:

And he commanded them to be baptized in the name of the Lord. Then they asked him to stay a few days.

Acts 10:48

Notice that in the above incidents Ananias and Peter did not simply have a word of prayer with their convert and then hurry off. On the contrary, they spent several days with their new brothers in Christ to encourage and establish them in the Christian life.

Absence of Parenting

If every church of the Twentieth Century would follow the Scriptural examples of the First Century Church in follow-up, Christianity would be mushrooming on all fronts. Yet sadly, many evangelical churches are nearly stagnant in their growth rate because they fail at this point. In my experience, nearly every church that is successful, dynamic, and growing can be found to have a carefully developed nurture program with equipped men and women who can provide the proper care for new Christians.

Provision of Parenting

Several years ago I was privileged to be the coordinator for the counseling and follow-up for a large Billy Graham Crusade. The Graham organization has well learned the importance of follow-up, and for ten months prior to the five-day crusade we were involved in a massive training program to equip Christians in the city as counselors and nurture group leaders. Of the 8,000 who took the counselor training, 5,000 were qualified and equipped to lead people to Christ at the crusade. These counselors were also prepared to help the inquirers to assurance of salvation and were responsible to contact the new converts within the first days following their decisions. Of the 2,200 who were trained as nurture group leaders, 1,800 led small Bible study groups for the converts for a period of eight weeks to a year

following the crusade. As a result of this massive emphasis on followup, a large percentage of those who found Christ at the crusade were successfully integrated into the life of the Church. A great side benefit, of course, was that churches all over the city began to realize the importance of follow-up, and through the ten months of training given to church members, many became equipped to both lead another to Christ and to establish their new convert in the faith.

Ensure Proper Protection

The Scripture clearly tells us that we are engaged in a great spiritual battle for the souls of men and women.

> Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places. *Ephesians 6:10-12*

Satan has great power and authority over all who do not know Christ.

...in which you once walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit who now works in the sons of disobedience.

Ephesians 2:2

When a person comes to Christ he rejects the authority of Satan and makes Jesus his new King and Lord.

> He has delivered us from the power of darkness and translated us into the kingdom of the Son of His love. Colossians 1:13

Of course, when this change takes place, Satan is enraged. Although he has now forever lost one of his captives, he will continue to try to stunt the Christian growth of that one who now belongs to Christ. Since all of us have been under his dominion at one time, he knows every weakness we have and will forever try to tempt us into a life of sin which will make us ineffective for Christ.

Every person engaged in follow-up must understand Satan's tactics and warn the new Christian about the attacks he is likely to face. Many times the new convert is ashamed to share the struggles. doubts, and defeats that he is going through. The new convert simply cannot imagine that good Christian people have these problems. Not wanting to be rejected by his Christian friends, he struggles on alone.

Separate | Isolate | Destroy

It is very important, therefore, that the person doing the follow-up be honest and transparent—sharing his own "open nerves" and struggles with his young Christian friend. He must warn the new Christian that Satan is very real and very present and teach him how to appropriate Christ's strength in overcoming the enemy.

If you are unaware of how Satan works, C. S. Lewis' *Screwtape Letters* gives a delightfully accurate satire of the enemy's tactics.

One of the follow-up discipleship plans first objectives is to get the person into the warm fellowship of the Church family which provides strength and protection from Satan. Christian friendship is a strong deterrent to many of Satan's attacks. God's Word says that:

Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their labor. For if they fall, one will lift up his companion. But woe to him who is alone when he falls, for he has no one to help him up.

Ecclesiastes 4:9,10

Since this fellowship is so vital to the new believer, Satan will do everything possible to see that he does not make it to church. The new Christian will find many excuses:

- He has to work overtime or hold two jobs.
- The kids get sick.
- Company arrives unexpectedly.
- He oversleeps.
- A conflicting opportunity arises.
- The car breaks down on the way.
- The "Game of the Week" is scheduled during church hour.
- His spouse doesn't want to go.

If all of these things do not stop the believer from getting to church, Satan will use the immaturity of some Christians to offend him so that he will not want to come back. Perhaps one of the most effective things we can do to protect young believers from Satan's attack is to pray defensively in their behalf. Through our prayers we can "bind" Satan through Christ's power, preventing him from plundering the new believer's life.

Or else how can one enter a strong man's house and plunder his goods, unless he first binds the strong

man? And then he will plunder his house. Matthew 12:29

Remember—Satan is a dirty fighter and will stop at nothing to immobilize his former subjects. Be prepared for him as you follow-up.

Ensure a Proper Diet

Jesus told us that a person needs more than physical food to survive in the Christian life. The Bible is the essential spiritual food for the soul.

> But He answered and said, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God.'"

> > Matthew 4:4

Peter reminds us that the Word of God is necessary for spiritual growth.

> As newborn babes, desire the pure milk of the word, that you may grow thereby...

> > 1 Peter 2:2

When a baby is born, he is completely dependent upon his parents for food. He doesn't know where the food is kept or how to prepare it. All of the preparation must be done by his parents. The baby simply ingests it. In the early days of life, the baby must eat simple foods in small portions, and he must eat frequently. Sometimes parents are up several times a night to see that the child receives his food.

Spiritual babes are very much the same. If they are not fed, they do not grow. They need a parent who understands their needs and gives them simple, basic food from the Word of God. The spiritual parent must show them how to read and study the Bible for themselves. This way they can eat daily rather than only once or twice a week in church.

Most children, if left to choose their own diet, would probably exist on sweets. However, the wise parent will see that his child gets a balanced diet of meat, vegetables, fruit, and milk, with some sweets. Spiritual children also try to eat a diet of only the pleasant part of the Scripture. They like to hear about God's love and grace, and they all love the warm fellowship of the Church. But this is not all God wants them to know. They must also learn about Lordship and personal discipline. The wise spiritual parent will ensure that his babe receives a balanced diet of spiritual intake and activities. We have already learned that there are five ways of getting the Word of God into our

own personal lives. As spiritual parents, we also must make sure our children learn to be effective in each of the five areas by—

- Meditating,
 - Memorizing,
 - Studying,
 - · Reading, &
 - Hearing the Word of God.

Ensure Love and Acceptance

The new Christian needs to be aware of God's unchanging and unconditional love for him.

Behold what manner of love the Father has bestowed on us, that we should be called children of God! Therefore the world does not know us, because it did not know Him.

1 John 3:1

Though God hates sin, He does love sinners and longs to set them free from sin's hold on their lives. That is why He sent His Son, Jesus, to pay the penalty for sin so that once again we could have fellowship with God. The young believer needs to hear this story again and again and realize that because of Christ's sacrifice, he is fully forgiven and accepted by God.

One of the ways a spiritual babe learns about God's love is by seeing it and experiencing it through the Church family. Christ commanded that those who name His name should be channels of His love to one another.

A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another.

John 13:34-35

The Church family which obeys this command and loves one another is bound to grow. They will consistently put the needs of each other before their own, and they will see people not as problems, but as opportunities to demonstrate God's love. In a world which knows nothing of real love, the true Christian fellowship shines like a light. Young Christians should be able to find the same redemptive, noncondemning, helping love within the Church that they read about in the Bible.

Because we loved you, it was a joy to us to give you not only the Gospel of God but our very hearts—so dear did you become to us.

1 Thessalonians 2:8 (JBP)

Ensure Personal Accountability to God

Paul tells us:

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new.

2 Corinthians 5:17

As we become new creatures in Christ, we notice a change in our lifestyle. The things we did when we served the prince of darkness must now be replaced by obedience to God's commands. An essential part of follow-up is to teach young believers exactly what God expects of them since He is now their sovereign. Jesus instructed the eleven:

> Teaching them to observe (obey) all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age. Amen. Matthew 28:20

As any parent knows, growing children need growing responsibilities so that they will become responsible adults. This involves years of careful teaching and training by the parents. If the parents are successful, the children will grow up to realize that they must live responsibly under the laws of society in order to receive its blessings.

Similarly, spiritual parents need to train their children to be responsible and accountable to God for the things they do. Young Christians must realize that only when they obey God's Word can they expect to grow and prosper. When they sin, they must be aware that while they may fool everyone else, God still knows, and they must give account to Him. As responsible spiritual parents, we must implant the truth of these spiritual laws:

> Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap.

Galatians 6:7

He who has My commandments and keeps them, it is he who loves Me. And he who loves Me will be loved by My Father, and I will love him and manifest Myself to him.

John 14:21

John 8:32

How to Implement These Principles

Someone must assume a parenting or shepherding role

Almost any layman can be trained to be effective in follow-up, but someone must be willing to take a personal responsibility for another. Follow-up is **not** a program only; it involves people. It is only through a personal relationship between spiritual parent and spiritual child that effective and lasting growth can take place.

Teach young Christians to have a relationship with Christ

Each individual must have his own personal relationship with Christ and be able to maintain and grow in that relationship. No one can live off someone else's relationship—no matter how dynamic it may be. Each new Christian must learn to read and study the Bible for himself and to spend time with God in prayer and fellowship. Initially, it is good to encourage a convert to read through one of the Gospels (like Mark or John) several times before going on to other books. This allows the Holy Spirit to introduce the person to Jesus Christ in an intimate way, which teaches him who He is, what He did, and why He is the Source of eternal life. As the person gets to know Christ in this way, the Spirit can minister to the deepest needs of his heart—needs of which no other may even be aware. A vertical relationship with God must be established between God and each believer if he is to grow and be healthy in the Christian life. Jesus described it like this:

I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing.

John 15:5

In helping a person get started with his devotional life, you may want to have a quiet time with him for several days to show him how to do it. The booklet "Appointment with God" is of great help in teaching this.

Teach Scripture Memory

Hiding God's Word in the heart is one of the most effective ways a person can protect himself from Satan's attacks. The Word of God is the "sword of the Spirit," and with it available and ready in our hearts and minds, the Spirit can use it to defeat Satan.

The Bible promises victory to those who do discipline themselves to memorize Scripture.

The law of his God is in his heart; None of his steps shall slide.

Psalm 37:31

In our *ETS* Follow-Up Guide for a new convert, we used the first five verses from the Navigator follow-up material called Beginning With Christ. These five verses deal with certain assurances important for a new convert's growth. We also use the Topical Memory System which consists of sixty Bible verses. These verses provide a balanced diet to the Christian life. These and other verses are all a part of the ETS Convert Guide.

Involve young Christians in a warm church **fellowship**

Each Christian must not only have a vertical relationship with God, but horizontal relationships to others. A warm, loving, Bible-believing church fellowship is essential for Christian growth.

Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching. Hebrews 10:25

Your Story

Now that you've seen how Paul gave his story, work on a way to tell yours. Sharing how **YOU** became a Christian can be one of the best ways to witness. It is particularly helpful in presenting Jesus Christ to relatives and close friends.

In sharing the story of your experience:

Make it personal—don't preach. Tell what Christ has done for you. Use "I," "me," and "my"—not "you."

Make it short. Three or four minutes should be enough time to cover the essential facts.

Keep Christ central. Always highlight what He has done for you.

Use the Word of God. A verse or two of Scripture will add power to your story. Remember that the Word of God has a keen cutting edge.

How to Prepare Your Story

Try writing your story down on the next page just the way you would tell it to an unbeliever. Make the story clear enough that the person hearing it would know how to receive Christ.

Tell a little about your life before you trusted Jesus Christ, then about your conversion—how you came to trust Him; and finally, something of what it has meant to know Him—the blessing of sins forgiven, assurance of eternal life, and other ways your life or outlook has changed.

If you have been a Christian for a number of years, be sure that your story includes some current information about the continuing effect of Christ in your life.

As you prepare your story, ask the Lord to give you opportunities to share it. Pray for two or three whom you would particularly like to tell about Jesus Christ in your neighborhood, at work or at school, and take the first opportunity to share your story with them.

In conclusion, *remember* that you do not have the power in yourself to convince anyone of spiritual truth. The Holy Spirit convicts non-Christians of their need to know Christ (John 16:8).

As you pray for those with whom you desire to share your story, be sure to ask God to honor the proclamation of His Word, to convince people of their need, and to strengthen you as you share the gospel.

Remember These Points:

According to the principles of Scripture, we are to be witnesses of what we see and hear of Christ.

We are witnesses by actions of love, by our lifestyle, and by our speech.

Paul's spoken testimony provides a pattern for verbal witness: telling what our life was like before we met Christ, telling how we met Christ, and telling what our life is like since meeting Him.



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BIBLE READING PROGRAM

Introduction

The Bible is God's revealed Word to men. Therefore, it is of utmost importance to discover what it says and obey it!

Many Christians confine their Bible reading to certain favorite portions and only when they feel the need. But the Scriptures declare, "The whole Bible was given by inspiration from God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives; it straightens us out and helps us do what is right. It is God's way of making us well-prepared at every point, fully equipped to do good to everyone" (2 Timothy 3:16,17, Living Bible).

Want to know a secret of the Apostle Paul's dynamic, fruitful life? Listen to his testimony, "This is why we never collapse. The outward man does indeed suffer wear and tear, but everyday the inward man receives fresh strength" (2 Corinthians 4:16, Phillips). To keep spiritually fit we need the whole Bible, and we need to feed our souls from it daily.

Bible reading helps us know Jesus Christ better. We learn most about Jesus in the New Testament, particularly the Gospels, but He is actually the theme of the entire Book. After His resurrection Jesus astounded two of His disciples by beginning at Moses and all the prophets (the Old Testament) and interpreting to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself (see Luke 24:27). Look for Jesus Christ throughout the Bible.

People are groping for purpose and meaning to life. But we have undermined the very foundation for purposeful living by substituting God's truth with humanistic speculations. The result is more and more people confused, frustrated and in despair. How assuring are the words of Jesus to His Father, "Thy Word is truth!" Yes, the Book is true. And it is absolutely trustworthy. Men's theories undergo constant change, but the Bible needs no alteration. It is the most up-to-date Book there is. It is anchored in historical events and invites honest investigation. You can unreservedly place your confidence in it.

Develop the habit of regular, consecutive Bible reading and meditation and mark your growth in spiritual vitality, joy, stability and usefulness.

The Plan

- 1. You will read the New Testament in one year, and you can read the Old Testament either in one or two years.
- 2. Check the appropriate squares when you have read the specified portions. If you follow the one-year plan you will check both outside columns for the Old Testament, but only the left column in the shaded New Testament area.
- 3. Don't fall behind in your reading. If you miss a day continue to read according to date and as soon as possible make up the missed passages.
- 4. The Old Testament books are read in the order in which they appear in the Bible. If you follow the one-year plan, you will read in two sections of the Old Testament each day, beginning with Genesis and Ezra.
- 5. In keeping with the object of knowing Christ, the reading of the four Gospels is spaced throughout the year.
- 6. You will read an average of 54 verses a day for the two-year plan and 86 verses for the one-year plan.

Bible Reading Quiet Time Program

In Chapter Ten our lesson was the Quiet Time and its importance in learning how to develop our own personal relationship to the Lord. At that time we introduced you to a very simple 31-day Quiet Time program, called Appointment With God. This program guided you through a series of different ways, or patterns, you could use in addressing a passage of Scripture. Last week you completed the Appointment With God series.

In this lesson you are introduced to a Bible Reading Program which allows you to use these passages of Scripture to guide you in developing your relationship with God. These Bible Reading charts will take you through the entire Bible in one or *two years*.

If you do not have some other Quiet Time reading program you are following, let me encourage you to let the Bible Reading Program become your guide for Quiet Time passages.





Introduction

The Great Commission will never be accomplished until every disciple is "fishing for men." In this lesson we will be teaching you how to present the Gospel of Jesus Christ to another person. The tool we use is called the **Bridge** illustration. We use the Socratic form of evangelism in which people are given basic information and then asked specific questions based on the information. This has proven to be a very effective method of presenting the Gospel for a number of reasons:

- It creates a deductive dialogue.
- To answer the questions people must **reason** from the information given.
- The answer establishes the premises from which we continue to reason.
- People tell you what you wanted to tell them.
- People discover the truth on their own rather than by your giving them the answers.
- You have immediate feedback on what people do and don't understand.
- The truth is visualized as you write the answer into the illustration.


You are asked to memorize the following sequence of questions. You need not memorize word for word as you would memorize a Bible verse. However, if you adjust the questions, make sure that the question extracts the answer you want. A sloppy question may extract the wrong answer and hinder rather than help you. Memorize the sequence of questions in bold print. The logical answers are printed in script. Both are printed together so you can see the flow of thought for the dialogue.

Gospel Presentation

A person must understand three things to become a Child of God or, in other words, a Christian. With your permission, I would like to show you from the Bible what these three things are. Okay, if it doesn't take too long, I have a few minutes.

The First Thing

The Bible records that God made Adam and Eve and placed them in the Garden of Eden with clear instructions about the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil. They lived in perfect harmony with God and had fellowship with Him.



One day however, something happened in the Garden that caused a barrier to be erected between them and their Creator so that they could no longer have fellowship with Him.


Can you tell me what that was?

Was this when they ate the fruit and disobeyed God?


Yes, Adam and Eve chose to listen to the serpent's reasoning rather than God's command. There is a special word the Bible uses for this disobedience. Do you know what the Bible calls it?

Was it sin?

That's right-it was sin.



We could illustrate this another way; we could put man standing on one side of a cliff, God on the other side and SIN in between, separating them.



The Bible talks about this in Romans 3:23.

Would you please read this passage to me?

"For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."

According to this passage, how many have sinned?

It says "all."


Does this mean I have sinned?

It says "all," so I guess that means you.

Does it mean that you, too, have sinned?

Yes, it means that I, too, have sinned.

Now that's the first thing a man must understand to become a Christian. Let's write that down.



The Second Thing

The second thing that a man must understand to become a Christian is found in Romans 6:23. Here the author draws a conclusion to this matter of sin.

Would you please read this passage to me?

NOTES


"For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

God does not expect us to labor and make this world a better place to live without paying us a wage. God fully intends to pay us a wage for all that we have ever done.

However, here God says that the wage for our sin is what?

It says "death."

This is the second thing that a man must understand to become a Christian, so let's write that down.



We could say many things about death. But if we reduce it to its simplest form, it is mere separation. Several years ago, my father-in-law died. Now he is in one place and I am in another; death has separated us. When Adam and his wife sinned, they died spiritually and were separated from God.

The Third Thing

The third thing that a man must understand to become a Christian is found in Hebrews 9:27.


Would you please read this verse to me?

"And as it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment."

According to this verse, when a man dies he has an appointment with God, for what?

Judgment.

Since that is the third thing that a man must understand to become a Christian, let's write it down.




Now if it is true that all men have sinned, and that the penalty for sin is death and separation from God, and that the day is coming when man will be judged. This does not paint a very bright picture, does it?

No, it certainly does not.

Down through the ages, man has understood this and has tried to make his way back to God.

What are some ways you think men try to make their way back to God?

By living a good moral life? Being religious? Helping his fellow man?



You are right—this is how men try to make or work their way back to God. However, we learned in Romans 3:23 that all our efforts fall short of what God requires. In John 5:24, God reveals what is required. Here we learn three very interesting things that are relevant to what we have already learned.

I wonder if you would read this verse to me?

"Most assuredly, I say to you, he who hears My word and believes in Him who sent Me **has** everlasting life, and **shall** not come into judgment, but has **passed** from death into life."

Who's speaking?

I guess it's Jesus.

That's right-Jesus says that if you will hear His Words...

Are these my words or Jesus'?

Jesus'.

.And believe in Him who sent me...

Who sent Jesus?


God.

Three things would happen.

What are they?

- Has everlasting life
- Shall not face judgment
- ullet Passed from death to life

So let's write those down on the other side of the ravine.



Notice the tenses of the verbs in each of the above phrases.

In what tense is 'has"-past, future, or present?

Present tense.

What does the present tense in this statement mean?

It means that right now, in the present, I can have eternal life.

That's right. Now in what tense is "shall not"—present, past or future?

Future tense.

So what does this phrase mean?

I will not be judged at some future date.

That's right. Now in what tense is "passed" future, present or past?

Past tense.

And what does this phrase mean?


I have already passed from death into life.

That's right. It is important that you understand this because if you now have everlasting life, what does that do to death?

It crosses out death.

If you shall not be judged, what does that do to judgment?

It cancels judgment.



When I hear God calling and believe, that means:

- Intellectually I understand the facts of the Gospel;
- Emotionally I know and want to act on what I have heard;

• <u>Volitionally</u> I turn from man's side to God's side and place my faith in Jesus' finished work on the Cross for my sin.


This allows me to pass over to God's side. The Bible says:

God is on one side and all the people on the other; Jesus, Himself man, is between them to bring them together, by giving His life for all mankind.

1 Timothy 2:5 (LB)

For I delivered to you first of all that which I also received: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures...

1 Corinthians 15:3,4



If you were to place yourself into this illustration, where would you draw yourself?

I would place myself on man's side.

Is that where you want to be?

No.

Where do you want to be?

Over on God's side.

Do you know how to get there?

I'm not sure.

Let's look at John 1:12.

Will you read this verse to me?

"But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name."

What must a man do to become a Child of God?

He must receive "Him."

Must receive whom?

Jesus Christ.

Do you know how to receive Him?

I'm not sure.

Let's look at another verse in Revelation 3:20.

Will you read this to me?

"Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and dine with him, and he with Me."

Who is speaking?

Jesus.

What is He doing?

He is knocking at the door.

What door?

The door to man's heart and life.

Why is He knocking?

Because He wants to come in.

NOTES The way to receive Christ is to open the door of your heart and life and let Him in. To get from man's side to God's side, all you must do when we pray is repent of your sins, and ask God to do three things: • Forgive you for your sins. • Come into your life and help you to become the kind of person He created you to be. • Give you the gift of eternal life so that you might be with Him forever. I am going to ask you to pray these three things loud enough so that when you have finished I can say a prayer to God for you. Let's pray.



Introduction

One of Christ's primary ministries while here on earth was that of teaching. His disciples and the multitudes frequently referred to Him as "Rabbi" or "Teacher." When He returned to Heaven, Jesus set forth the mandate for the eleven to go and "make disciples of all nations" and "teach them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you" (Matthew 28:18-20). *Teaching*, therefore, became one of the vital ingredients in effective follow-up.

In Acts 2, we read that on the Day of Pentecost, through the witness of Peter, some 3,000 people were won to Christ, and with this event the first follow-up program in Christian history had begun. The apostles taught the new believers the things Christ had taught them, and the Church went from miraculously *adding* to *multiplying*.

The Conversion of 3,000


Then the churches throughout all Judea, Galilee, and Samaria had peace and were edified. And walking in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit, they were multiplied.

Basic Ingredients in Teaching

The Word of God

In order to teach another person what Jesus has taught us, we must teach the Word of God.



And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.

John 8:32

Jesus, of course, was the living embodiment of the Word of God. What God had once taught only by the spoken and written word was now being lived out in Christ's life.


In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through Him, and without Him nothing was made that was made.

John 1:1-3

And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth.

John 1:14

As these verses explain, God revealed to man, through the Written Word and the Living Word, the things he needed to know to please and obey Him. Paul reminds us that the Word of God is inspired, or "Godbreathed," and is profitable in four main areas of teaching:



The Holy Spirit

Jesus told His disciples that it was necessary for Him to leave the earth so that the Holy Spirit could come to them. Jesus promised that when the Spirit came, He would perform various functions. He taught that the Holy Spirit would:

Comfort and Indwell Us

And I will pray the Father, and He will give you another Helper, that He may abide with you forever, even the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees Him nor knows Him; but you know Him, for He dwells with you and will be in you.

John 14:16,17

Teach Us All Things

But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all things that I said to you.

John 14:26

Testify about Jesus

But when the Helper comes, whom I shall send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who proceeds from the Father, He will testify of Me.

John 15:26

Bring Conviction of Sin

And when He has come, He will convict the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment.

John 16:8

Guide Us into all Truth

However, when He, the Spirit of truth, has come, He will guide you into all truth; for He will not speak on His own authority, but whatever He hears He will speak; and He will tell you things to come.

John 16:13

Glorify Christ

He will glorify Me, for He will take of what is Mine and declare it to you.

John 16:14

In the ministry of teaching and follow-up, we must recognize what an important Person the Holy Spirit is. He Who Dwells Within the Christian can minister to the deepest needs of the heart and mind. Our job is simply to give the Spirit the tool He needs to work with—the Word of God. As we share the Word with others through Bible Study, helping them to memorize and to have a Quiet Time, the Holy Spirit will custom tailor the passages to meet their deepest needs.

And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God... Ephesians 6:17

Pacesetting

In the Great Commission Jesus said that we are "to teach them to **observe** all things...." The word "observe" here can also be translated as "obey" or "to do." By teaching *active obedience*, we are teaching a new lifestyle—a lifestyle of *doing* and *acting* as Christians.

In teaching any *action* concept, the pupil must not only hear lectures on the subject, but he must also see the teacher demonstrate the skill. Imagine trying to learn gymnastics by lecture alone! Impossible! The potential gymnast must also be able to see a skilled athlete doing what he one day hopes to be able to do.

Jesus understood the importance of setting an example, or *paceset-ting*, for His followers. He selected twelve men to travel and live with Him as He went about His earthly ministry. Through this intimate companionship, He was able to teach them not only by His words, but also by His example. His life was His greatest message.

And He went up on the mountain and called to Him those He Himself wanted. And they came to Him. Then He appointed twelve, that they might be with Him and that He might send them out to preach...

Mark 3:13,14

The Apostle Paul was another disciple who realized the importance of pacesetting in the teaching of new Christians. Both the Thessalonian believers and Paul's young son in the faith, Timothy, learned to follow God by observing and following Paul's life as well as God's Word. Paul wrote...

For you remember, brethren, our labor and toil; for laboring night and day, that we might not be a burden to any of you, we preached to you the gospel of God. You are witnesses, and God also, how devoutly and justly and blamelessly we behaved ourselves among you who believe; as you know how we exhorted, and comforted, and charged every one of you, as a father does his own children.

1 Thessalonians 2:9-11

Paul also encouraged Timothy with these words:

But you have carefully followed my doctrine, manner of life, purpose, faith, longsuffering, love, perseverance (v. 10). But as for you, continue in the things which you have learned and been assured of, knowing from whom you have learned them, and that from childhood you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus (v. 14,15).

2 Timothy 3:10,14,15

To the Philippian Christians Paul said:

The things which you learned and received and heard and saw in me, these do, and the God of peace will be with you.

Philippians 4:9

Would you or I have the kind of life and walk with Christ which would allow us to exhort others to follow as Paul did? This may sound awesome and idealistic, but God is very concerned that those who disciple others would strive to be exactly what they teach. The cold, hard truth is that if people do not see the Christ-life in us, they will not embrace it for themselves.

Application in the Student's Life

Even if we teach the Word of God through the power of the Spirit and set the example in our own lives, others will not become disciples unless we lead them or they are taught to apply the Scriptures to their own personal lives.

James warns that believers cannot be satisfied with head knowledge alone:

But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves.

James 1:22

Jesus reminded His disciples that their lives would be filled with joy only when they actually practiced what they had been taught.

If you know these things, happy are you if you do them.

John 13:17

Jesus promised to make men successful in the art and act of fishing for men. He did not want to simply make them philosophers. He meant what He said when He spoke to them...

"Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men." Matthew 4:19

Steps in Teaching

Tell Them Why

If people do not understand why something is important to them or profitable, for them, they will not incorporate it into their lives. They may engage in an activity or program for a certain amount of time because of peer pressure, initial excitement, etc., but their lives will not be permanently changed for Christ. The teacher has a tremendous responsibility to make sure that his students understand why Christ's commands and teachings are important to them.

Therefore hear the parable of the sower: "When anyone hears the word of the kingdom, and does not understand it, then the wicked one comes and snatches away what was sown in his heart. This is he who received seed by the wayside. But he who received the seed on stony places, this is he who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy; yet he has no root in himself, but endures only for a while. For when tribulation or persecution arises because of the word, immediately he stumbles. Now he who received seed among the thorns is he who hears the word, and the cares of this world and the deceitfulness of riches choke the word, and he becomes unfruitful. But he who received seed on the good ground is he who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and produces: some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty."

Matthew 13:18-23

In this parable it is interesting to note that the "good seed" was the only one that "understood" or knew why. All **heard** but only *one* **understood**.

As we teach these principles of discipleship and try to help them understand, we must be careful to build all knowledge and understanding from the Word of God. The Holy Spirit will only bring conviction to a heart by using His Sword, the Word of God. Therefore, our message must always find its foundation in the Scriptures. We may choose to support our teaching from other sources, but the basic foundation must *always* be the Bible.

Show Them How

If people properly and clearly understand the why of an issue, they are usually motivated to do it. However, many people lack the practical know-how to begin a personal application. The successful teacher will use several tools to help his learners know how to actually apply the truth in daily life. This is the step which seeks to reduce theory down into reality and gives people confidence that they can actually do what they know they should.

Jesus *showed* His disciples *how* when He taught them to pray. His disciples asked Jesus to teach them to pray, and Jesus answered their request by actually setting up a model for them to follow. We call this model "The Lord's Prayer." By using this model and praying with them, Jesus taught His disciples to pray.

And it came to pass, as He was praying in a certain place, when He ceased, that one of His disciples said to Him, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John also taught his disciples." So He said to them, "When you pray, say: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done On earth as it is in heaven. Give us day by day our daily bread, and forgive us our sins, for we also forgive everyone who is indebted to us. And do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one."

Luke 11:1-4

To give you an example of how this principle works, consider the Bridge Illustration. Before learning the Bridge Illustration, many of you in this course knew that you should be presenting the Gospel to others, but you did not know how to do it clearly and concisely. When the Bridge was taught to you, you were not simply taught the dialogue and Scripture verses, but a role-playing demonstration was also set up to show you how it worked. In this way you were actually shown *how* to use the Bridge with another.

Get Them Started

Even after mastering a skill, people usually need a little encouragement and impetus to get them to use the new skill. Just as baby eagles need to be nudged out of the nest in order to learn to fly, most Christians need a gentle nudge by a godly teacher to get them to take the first step.

After spending some time teaching and training the twelve, Jesus launched them into a preaching and teaching exercise to help them begin practicing what they had learned.

These twelve Jesus sent out and commanded them, saying: "Do not go into the way of the Gentiles, and do not enter a city of the Samaritans. But go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. And as you go, preach, saying 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Heal the sick, cleanse the lepers, raise the dead, cast out demons. Freely you have received, freely give. Provide neither gold nor silver nor copper in your moneybelt nor bag for your journey, nor two tunics, nor sandals, nor staffs; for a worker is worthy of his food."

Matthew 10:5-10

In the same way, you were required in the course not only to memorize and practice the Bridge Illustration in class, but also to share it with outsiders with whom you should feel comfortable. Now you are encouraged to give the Bridge to two non-Christians as part of your assignment for the course. This requirement helps you to launch out into the real world of winning the lost.

Keep Them Going

Though a learner develops convictions and is actually doing what you have taught him, the teacher's job is not yet done. Satan is eager to side-track Christians and get them to quit doing what they know to do. The faithful teacher will continue to check on his student, to encourage him, and to pray for him so he will *keep going* in the skill he has been taught. Only those who *keep going* will be able to reproduce themselves later in yet other lives.

One of the most effective ways to *keep them going* is to help the learners write objectives for the skills you have taught them to do.

Get Them Reproducing

The first commandment God ever gave to man was to reproduce.

Then God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it; have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over every living thing that moves on the earth."

Genesis 1:28

Not only are we to reproduce physically, but spiritually as well.

By this My Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit; so you will be My disciples. You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit, and that your fruit should remain, that whatever you ask the Father in My name He may give you.

John 15:8,16

Not until the teacher can see his student actually beginning to reproduce himself in the lives of others is the task complete. When the learner has his own small band of disciples who are looking to him for guidance, then he becomes the new pacesetter and teacher. He will then be forced to practice the discipline of Christian living for the benefit of those who are following him, and the process will begin all over again.

Summary—What To Teach

Jesus told us to teach others to *obey all the things He has taught us*. As we study the Scriptures, we must list the teachings of Christ which are necessary for us to pass on to others.

There are four general areas that must be communicated when making disciples.

- *Instruction*—Imparting knowledge
- *Training*—Imparting ministry skills
- Building—Teaching character traits
- $\bullet \ \textbf{\textit{Developing}} \text{Teaching leadership and spiritual gifts}$

My good friend and colaborer, Don Arvin, after reviewing this lesson said, "Dawson, you need to summarize this lesson with this simple, yet profound, chart." I agreed.

This chart gives us the three key words of Teaching—Know, Be, Do.

Today's world is characterized by many inventions which meet people's needs quickly and easily: instant foods, instant electronic communication, instant information stored in high speed computers, etc. Christians must remember, however, that there is no such thing as "instant maturity" in the Christian experience. Becoming a Christian begins a lifetime adventure of knowing God better and loving Him more.

Don't let the world around you squeeze you into its own mold, but let God remake you so that your whole attitude of mind is changed. Thus you will prove in practice that the will of God is good, acceptable to him and perfect.



A ONE YEAR BIBLE READING PROGRAM

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BIBLE READING PROGRAM

Introduction

The Bible is God's revealed Word to men. Therefore, it is of utmost importance to discover what it says and obey it!

Many Christians confine their Bible reading to certain favorite portions and only when they feel the need. But the Scriptures declare, "The whole Bible was given by inspiration from God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives; it straightens us out and helps us do what is right. It is God's way of making us well-prepared at every point, fully equipped to do good to everyone" (2 Timothy 3:16,17, Living Bible).

Want to know a secret of the Apostle Paul's dynamic, fruitful life? Listen to his testimony, "This is why we never collapse. The outward man does indeed suffer wear and tear, but everyday the inward man receives fresh strength" (2 Corinthians 4:16, Phillips). To keep spiritually fit we need the whole Bible, and we need to feed our souls from it daily.

Bible reading helps us know Jesus Christ better. We learn most about Jesus in the New Testament, particularly the Gospels, but He is actually the theme of the entire Book. After His resurrection Jesus astounded two of His disciples by beginning at Moses and all the prophets (the Old Testament) and interpreting to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself (see Luke 24:27). Look for Jesus Christ throughout the Bible.

People are groping for purpose and meaning to life. But we have undermined the very foundation for purposeful living by substituting God's truth with humanistic speculations. The result is more and more people confused, frustrated and in despair. How assuring are the words of Jesus to His Father, "Thy Word is truth!" Yes, the Book is true. And it is absolutely trustworthy. Men's theories undergo constant change, but the Bible needs no alteration. It is the most up-to-date Book there is. It is anchored in historical events and invites honest investigation. You can unreservedly place your confidence in it.

Develop the habit of regular, consecutive Bible reading and meditation and mark your growth in spiritual vitality, joy, stability and usefulness.

The Plan

- 1. You will read the New Testament in one year, and you can read the Old Testament either in one or two years.
- 2. Check the appropriate squares when you have read the specified portions. If you follow the one-year plan you will check both outside columns for the Old Testament, but only the left column in the shaded New Testament area.
- 3. Don't fall behind in your reading. If you miss a day continue to read according to date and as soon as possible make up the missed passages.
- 4. The Old Testament books are read in the order in which they appear in the Bible. If you follow the one-year plan, you will read in two sections of the Old Testament each day, beginning with Genesis and Ezra.
- 5. In keeping with the object of knowing Christ, the reading of the four Gospels is spaced throughout the year.
- 6. You will read an average of 54 verses a day for the two-year plan and 86 verses for the one-year plan.

Bible Reading Quiet Time Program

In Chapter Ten our lesson was the Quiet Time and its importance in learning how to develop our own personal relationship to the Lord. At that time we introduced you to a very simple 31-day Quiet Time program, called Appointment With God. This program guided you through a series of different ways, or patterns, you could use in addressing a passage of Scripture. Last week you completed the Appointment With God series.

In this lesson you are introduced to a Bible Reading Program which allows you to use these passages of Scripture to guide you in developing your relationship with God. These Bible Reading charts will take you through the entire Bible in one or *two years*.

If you do not have some other Quiet Time reading program you are following, let me encourage you to let the Bible Reading Program become your guide for Quiet Time passages.

Definition of Learning

Learning is the process by which new information is ingested, analyzed, and prepared for storage in the memory until it is required for use by the mind in performing its various functions.

What Is Learning?

It is important to realize these functions:

• Telling is not teaching.

• Listening is not learning.

Expounding and explaining an idea in detail may require great time and effort on the part of the speaker, but no guarantee is offered that learning has taken place on the part of the listeners. Even Jesus, the greatest Teacher of all time, had to face this truth.



And the disciples came and said to Him, "Why do You speak to them in parables?" He answered and said to them, "Because it has been given to you to know the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven, but to them it has not been given. For whoever has, to him more will be given, and he will have abundance; but whoever does not have, even what he has will be taken away from him. Therefore I speak to them in parables, because seeing they do not see, and hearing they do not hear, nor do they understand."

Matthew 13:10-13

Most of the people who heard Jesus' parables stopped right there—just hearing. They did not understand, nor did they care to. It was only to those disciples who came to Jesus asking and eager that He was able to truly teach the deep meaning of what He said.

The same problem occurred when Jesus tried to explain about His approaching death.

So the Jews answered and said to Him, "What sign do You show to us, since You do these things?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." Then the Jews said, "It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and will You raise it up in three days?" But He was speaking of the temple of His body. Therefore, when He had risen from the dead, His disciples remembered that He had said this to them; and they believed the Scripture and the word which Jesus had said.

John 2:18-22

Though Jesus had communicated a deep truth, neither the Pharisees nor the disciples grasped it. They heard, yet they really *had not heard* at all. The truth had slipped right past them without their even knowing it. It was not until much later, after Jesus' death and resurrection, that the disciples had a new framework of understanding and began to comprehend what the Lord had said.

Learning—Joint Effort of Teacher/Student

Learning is a joint effort between teacher and student. It is clear that a cooperation must be present between the teacher and the listener if learning is to take place. It is the teacher's responsibility to secure the student's attention and to present the material in such a way that the student can understand it. The student, on the other hand, is responsible to give the teacher his attention and to try to understand what is being communicated.

Learning takes place only when the teacher has successfully transmitted the idea from his own mind to the mind of the listener. If, however, the idea which was transmitted by the teacher was not received in the same form by the listener, no learning has occurred. Miscommunication or confusion is the result.

In addition to grasping the material, the listener must also be able to apply the knowledge to solving related problems. Simply parroting the information is not enough—it must be ingested.

How People Learn

Analysis of Data

When information has been ingested, the brain records the entry and immediately begins the work of analysis. It does this by interpreting

the new information in the light of other data which has been filed and stored previously. In its organized fashion, the brain tries to file the new facts into its memory bank—not haphazardly—but with order. The new information must be systematically related to what the brain already knows. If information is unclear and cannot be interpreted for assimilation and future use, the mind will do one of two things:

- If the data is irrelevant or unimportant, the mind simply *tunes it out* or goes into *neutral*.
- If the data is important, the mind will begin to formulate questions and demand more information so as to clarify and assimilate it for storage and future action.

Ingestion—The Five Natural Senses

Learning begins by ingesting information through one or more of the five senses: **sight, hearing, touch, smell,** and **taste.**

A baby who puts his hand on the hot stove may have to learn the meaning of the word "hot" through his sense of **touch**. As he grows, he will learn that the **smell** of cooking food means dinner will soon be served; ice cream has a cold, smooth, sweet **taste**; **hearing** his daddy's firm command means he had better obey; **seeing** the beautiful flowers means spring is coming. Millions of concepts are absorbed by any growing human—without his even being aware of it—through the natural senses.

Sometimes people are born with one or more of their senses impaired. This may slow the learning process at first, but it will eventually force the other senses to compensate. If a person were to find himself with all five senses inoperative, it would be impossible for him to learn from another person. His learning would then be very slow and would come from repeated trial and error.

In our study of evangelism in chapter seven, we learn from Stevens' Law that the five senses are vital to our decision-making. We can now understand more fully why this is true. Since decision-making is a process of the mind, it is very dependent upon the information that has been or is being ingested and analyzed. This ingestion is largely accomplished through the five natural senses.

Ingestion and The Spiritual "Sixth Sense"

In addition to the five natural senses, every born-again Child of God is blessed with a *sixth sense* when the Holy Spirit takes up residence in his life.

But God has revealed them to us through His Spirit. For the Spirit searches all things, yes, the deep things of God. For what man knows the things of a man except the spirit of the man which is in him? Even so no one knows the things of God except the Spirit of God. Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, that we might know the things that have been freely given to us by God. These things we also speak, not in words which man's wisdom teaches but which the Holy Spirit teaches, comparing spiritual things with spiritual. But the natural man does not receive the things of the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him; nor can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned.

1 Corinthians 2:10-14

This passage means exactly what it says. The only people who can enjoy a personal relationship with God and understand spiritual truth are those who have the Spirit of God living within them. When a person invites Christ into his life, the *Third Person* of the Trinity—the Holy Spirit—takes up residence in his life and establishes a new relationship and understanding between the person and God. As the person grows in this relationship, he will discover that Someone has *turned on a spiritual lightbulb* in his mind. The things of God and the teachings of the Bible, which were once so vague and distant, are now clear and personal. This is the work of the Holy Spirit. He gives increasing understanding and deep insights of God because He is the very mind of Christ. He is our *sixth sense* in discerning and learning.

Key to Learning—Holy Spirit

Consider what the following passages teach about the enlightening work of the Holy Spirit.

But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all things that I said to you. John 14:26

However, when He, the Spirit of truth, has come, He will guide you into all truth; for He will not speak on His own authority, but whatever He hears He will speak; and He will tell you things to come. He will glorify Me, for He will take of what is Mine and declare it to you. All things that the Father has are Mine. Therefore I said that He will take of Mine and declare it to you.

John 16:13-15

It is very important that the Christian teacher realize the importance of this sixth sense when trying to impart spiritual truth. If the Spirit of God does not dwell within the listener, there is no way that he can understand what the teacher is saying. If the teacher finds his listener is not grasping spiritual truth, he may want to double check the person's salvation experience. It may be that the reason he is not understanding is that he has never truly received Christ.

Factors Which Aid Learning

Understanding

Understanding comes by ingesting information in a way which is—

Interesting,

· Relevant, and

Logically presented.

If a person can begin with what he knows and work toward the unknown, step by step, he will find that understanding will come easily.

The teacher who aims at helping his students to achieve understanding will find this is not an easy task. It requires that the teacher must master the material being taught and must also be sensitive to his students and their needs.

If the teacher senses that his listeners have not grasped a certain point, he will know that he must not proceed until they do. Then he must try to tackle the problem from a different or more creative angle until the truth is thoroughly ingested. Of course, this is not an easy task and will require much time and effort by the teacher. It will, however, pay off handsomely in the achieving of understanding.

For precept must be upon precept, precept upon precept, line upon line, line upon line, here a little, there a little.

Isaiah 28:10

Repetition

Information must be reviewed:

• In a practical way, and

Over a period of time.

This is so it can be recalled with 100% accuracy. The more faculties that can be used in review, the less time it will require to perfectly master the material. Some of the faculties helpful to use consist of the following.

SeeingSpeaking

Writing

Hearing

Retention NOTES

The ability to retain and recall information over a long period of time is based upon the student's original interest, understanding, overlearning, and reproduction.

Everyone at one time or other has passed exams on things he can no longer do or recall. If called upon today, he would be at a loss to reproduce the action or the information. It has simply lain in the mind too long without review. Unused truth is transferred from the conscious mind to the subconscious, and it sometimes becomes buried there. To recall it to the conscious would take a great deal of time and effort—and sometimes even relearning.

The only way to retain something is to—

Review it AND • Share it

Reproduction

The ability to accurately reproduce material which has been ingested is based upon our understanding of the material and degree to which it has been overlearned.

Reproduction forces the brain to process the data received so that it can be transmitted. This processing of data requires **review** of the information which, in turn, aids **retention**.

It has been said:

Thoughts disentangle themselves passing through the lips or through the fingertips.

Application

Learning which is never acted upon soon becomes dormant because it is not relevant to daily life. Application puts into practice that which has been learned and causes the information to be of personal value to the learner.

And Moses called all Israel, and said to them: "Hear, O Israel, the statutes and judgments which I speak in your hearing today, that you may learn them and be careful to observe them."

Deuteronomy 5:1

When Jesus commanded the Eleven to make disciples, He was not calling them to a life of philosophy but one of service.

Teaching them to observe (obey) all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age. Amen.

Matthew 28:20

It is clear that the kind of *teaching* Jesus desires here is not simply *head knowledge*, but it is the teaching which results in obedience and application. The teacher is to work with the learner until the content of the instruction is not only observable in the learner's life, but to the extent that it is so deeply understood the learner can teach it to another.





A ONE YEAR BIBLE READING PROGRAM

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BIBLE READING PROGRAM

Introduction

The Bible is God's revealed Word to men. Therefore, it is of utmost importance to discover what it says and obey it!

Many Christians confine their Bible reading to certain favorite portions and only when they feel the need. But the Scriptures declare, "The whole Bible was given by inspiration from God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives; it straightens us out and helps us do what is right. It is God's way of making us well-prepared at every point, fully equipped to do good to everyone" (2 Timothy 3:16,17, Living Bible).

Want to know a secret of the Apostle Paul's dynamic, fruitful life? Listen to his testimony, "This is why we never collapse. The outward man does indeed suffer wear and tear, but everyday the inward man receives fresh strength" (2 Corinthians 4:16, Phillips). To keep spiritually fit we need the whole Bible, and we need to feed our souls from it daily.

Bible reading helps us know Jesus Christ better. We learn most about Jesus in the New Testament, particularly the Gospels, but He is actually the theme of the entire Book. After His resurrection Jesus astounded two of His disciples by beginning at Moses and all the prophets (the Old Testament) and interpreting to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself (see Luke 24:27). Look for Jesus Christ throughout the Bible.

People are groping for purpose and meaning to life. But we have undermined the very foundation for purposeful living by substituting God's truth with humanistic speculations. The result is more and more people confused, frustrated and in despair. How assuring are the words of Jesus to His Father, "Thy Word is truth!" Yes, the Book is true. And it is absolutely trustworthy. Men's theories undergo constant change, but the Bible needs no alteration. It is the most up-to-date Book there is. It is anchored in historical events and invites honest investigation. You can unreservedly place your confidence in it.

Develop the habit of regular, consecutive Bible reading and meditation and mark your growth in spiritual vitality, joy, stability and usefulness.

The Plan

- 1. You will read the New Testament in one year, and you can read the Old Testament either in one or two years.
- 2. Check the appropriate squares when you have read the specified portions. If you follow the one-year plan you will check both outside columns for the Old Testament, but only the left column in the shaded New Testament area.
- 3. Don't fall behind in your reading. If you miss a day continue to read according to date and as soon as possible make up the missed passages.
- 4. The Old Testament books are read in the order in which they appear in the Bible. If you follow the one-year plan, you will read in two sections of the Old Testament each day, beginning with Genesis and Ezra.
- 5. In keeping with the object of knowing Christ, the reading of the four Gospels is spaced throughout the year.
- 6. You will read an average of 54 verses a day for the two-year plan and 86 verses for the one-year plan.

Bible Reading Quiet Time Program

In Chapter Ten our lesson was the Quiet Time and its importance in learning how to develop our own personal relationship to the Lord. At that time we introduced you to a very simple 31-day Quiet Time program, called Appointment With God. This program guided you through a series of different ways, or patterns, you could use in addressing a passage of Scripture. Last week you completed the Appointment With God series.

In this lesson you are introduced to a Bible Reading Program which allows you to use these passages of Scripture to guide you in developing your relationship with God. These Bible Reading charts will take you through the entire Bible in one or *two years*.

If you do not have some other Quiet Time reading program you are following, let me encourage you to let the Bible Reading Program become your guide for Quiet Time passages.



The Road to Maturity

A Christian may long and pray for the day his non-Christian friend will come to Christ. He is faithful in his witness and his intercession, and at last the day comes when he leads the person to Christ. At this point the Christian witness may think his job is complete, but in reality, his work has just begun.

Spiritual birth is very similar to physical birth. When parents welcome their new son or daughter into the world, they know that their job has just started. For the next eighteen to twenty years, the work of bringing the child to maturity will be a consuming responsibility for the father and mother.

All parents facing such a task wish that they had a "Never-Fail Manual on the Care and Feeding of Children." They wish there were a magic formula that would help them rear the child correctly so he would mature into a perfect adult. Unfortunately, no such manual exists. Parents soon realize that each of their children is different from the others and requires special attention in certain unique areas. Each child has special gifts, talents, weaknesses, and personality traits. No one **formula** could ever work for all children. The same is true for spiritual parents and children.

However, all parents, both physical and spiritual, can and should prayerfully set Biblical objectives for their children to help them grow and mature **physically**, **intellectually**, **socially**, and **spiritually** as Jesus did.

And Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and men.

Luke 2:52

In this lesson we will attempt to define certain stages of spiritual development and suggest a basic syllabus to help the Christian parent as he seeks to follow-up his spiritual child.

Kinds of Follow-Up

One person meets one-to-one with another in an effort to help him grow in his walk with Christ.

Group

One person meets with several people at a time—also for the purpose of helping them grow spiritually.

The application of these two kinds of follow-up can take a thousand different forms, but all follow-up will basically fall into one of these two categories. We can find both kinds demonstrated in Scripture. For example, Jesus started His ministry by working among the masses and multitudes. Eventually, He called out from these large groups twelve men whom He would train and send forth. Even out of the twelve, there were three who were closer to Jesus than any of the others, and often He would call them out to minister especially to them. These three were Peter, James, and John. Of these three yet another selection was made. Jesus chose Peter as the one who would lead His team of followers after His return to Heaven.

Relationships in Follow-Up

There are four basic relationships that can be developed in follow-up. All of them can be accomplished either with a group of young Christians or with one individual. All of them are important aspects of a total follow-up program.

Recreational

A merry heart does good, like medicine, but a broken spirit dries the bones.

Proverbs 17:22

Having fun together in a recreational setting can do great things for the spiritual parent-child relationship. As we relax together in an informal way, the new Christian is able to observe that the Christian life can be full of healthy and wholesome fun. The spiritual parent, in turn, can observe his spiritual child in a relaxed environment with his defenses down and begin to know the real person he is following up. Recreational follow-up lets the babe know his parent is interested in him as a whole person and enjoys being with him as a friend and not just as a spiritual client. Sporting activities, having meals together, and working on hobbies or crafts are just a few of the things which can be engaged in when establishing a recreational relationship.

Casual

You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, when you walk by the way, when you lie down, and when you rise up.

Deuteronomy 6:7

The casual relationship is also quite a loose and informal one. The spiritual parent simply attempts to use any informal opportunity available to build character and Christian practices into his babe. Meeting together casually at lunch break may give the Christian parent and child an opportunity to share blessings from their Quiet Times, to pray, to review verses or to have counselling time on various problems.

Christians should look for opportunities such as riding in the car or bus or walking somewhere together, occasional telephone calls or even letters to babes far away, spontaneous coffee dates, etc. Whatever casual situations arise, the key to making them effective is to work and pray to establish an honest and transparent communication. If the Christian parent is not willing to be honest and open and to share his struggles and needs, he cannot expect his babe to do so. We must all remember that we are dealing with people who have real life problems. We cannot expect them to share these needs if we appear to them as **perfect** or **preachy** or **moralistic**. At the same time, we do want to communicate that just as there are very real problems which we all must face, there is also a very real solution to each one in Christ.

Structured

"Teaching them to observe (obey) all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Amen.

Matthew 28:20

In the structured relationship we establish a certain time and place for regular Bible Study, prayer, and teaching. The Christian parent should have a clear idea of what he wants to teach his babe and why. A syllabus is very helpful here so that the structured time does not become a "hit or miss" operation. Stress should be placed on consistence, understanding the various Bible doctrines, and applying them to the personal life. Through the discipline of the structured relationship, we are able to build disciples who will be self-disciplined in days to come.

Partnership

Yet I considered it necessary to send to you Epaphroditus, my brother, fellow worker, and fellow soldier, but your messenger and the one who ministered to my need...

Philippians 2:25

In a partnership, the spiritual leader and babe team up to do the ministry together. Obviously this will not occur immediately after a

person is saved. Certain foundations and groundwork must first be established in the convert's life. But it is advisable that we also do not wait too long to introduce this aspect of follow-up. Even very young Christians should be led out by their more experienced parent to share their faith and win others to Christ. As they grow in maturity, spiritual children become peers with their parents—just as is true with physical children. When both the child and the parent are adults in spiritual maturity, they will be able to be co-laborers and encouragers to one another.

Stages of Growth

In his first epistle John describes three stages of growth for Christians:

I write to you, little children, because your sins are forgiven you for His name 's sake. I write to you, fathers, because you have known Him who is from the beginning. I write to you, young men, because you have overcome the wicked one. I write to you, little children, because you have known the Father. I have written to you, fathers, because you have known Him who is from the beginning. I have written to you, young men, because you are strong, and the Word of God abides in you, and you have overcome the wicked one.

1 John 2:12-14

The Apostle Paul adds a fourth stage when he writes to Titus:

For this reason I left you in Crete, that you should set in order the things that are lacking, and **appoint** elders in every city as I commanded you.

Titus 1:5

Babes or Children (Converts)

This is the stage of initial conversion. The main objective for this stage is to help the person get established in his daily relationship to Jesus Christ.

Young Men (Disciples)

In this stage a person is working on how to really become a committed follower of Christ. He is learning to overcome Satan and to abide and continue in the Word of God.

Fathers (Disciple-Makers)

These are people who have known and loved God for a long time. They have reproduced spiritual children and are faithfully continuing to do so.

Elders (Leaders of Disciple-Makers)

These are those who have been chosen to exercise a special role of leadership as undershepherds who lead and train others in the ministry.

Summary of Growth Related to Follow-Up Relationships

Stages of Growth Related to Relationships in Follow-Up

Children

Recreational and structured in groups and individually

Individual...Helps to get to know the person Group...Has the advantage of peer

pressure (especially good in working with teens)

Young Men (Disciples)

Recreational, structured, casual, and some partnership

Both group and individual time is important at this stage. Individual time is especially helpful in dealing with observed areas of need.

Fathers (Disciplemakers)

Structured should begin to be replaced with more partnership and casual time. Some recreational should also remain. Emphasis is on how to help him help his spiritual babes grow. *Man-to-man* individual time is more effective than groups in this stage.

Elders (Leaders of Disciplemakers)

Casual and partnership are the best relationships for this stage. Recreational is also good for mutual refreshment. Individual manto-man or couple-to-couple relationships are the most effective here.

Establishing Objectives Every Christian's Objective



The objective for every Christian—young or old—is to be an obedient Child of God. This objective is best illustrated by the Wheel.

Christ...must become the center of every believer's life through repentance from sin and inviting Christ into his life.

Vertical spokes...illustrate every believer's daily rela-

tionship with Christ. I communicate to Him through prayer, and He communicates to me through the Word of God.

Horizontal spokes...represent the outreach Christ wants me to have to others. There are only two kinds of people in the world from God's viewpoint: those with Christ, and those without Him. He wants me to relate to both. Through fellowship I reach out to other believers, and through witnessing I share Christ with the lost.

Objectives for Each Stage of Growth

- **Child (Convert)**—The objectives here should be:
 - ✓ Establish the vertical spokes in the wheel—the convert should clearly understand the Gospel and be assured of his salvation. Then he must be established in a daily communication with God through prayer and the Word.
 - ✓ Demonstrate a willingness to be identified with Christ— become part of a vital Church fellowship.
- Young Man (Disciple)—here the objective is two-fold:
 - ✓ Deepening the Relationship with Christ—through Lordship commitment in many or all areas of life and through deepening in the Word of God. The Word Hand (Bible Study Hand) should be evident in his life at this stage as well as a consistent devotional life and a teachable spirit.

- ✓ Sharing His Faith with Others—through learning and using the Bridge and developing his testimony. There should be a willingness to openly share Christ with others.
- **Father** (**Laborer or Disciplemaker**)—at this point the objectives should be:
 - ✓ Continual personal growth in the disciples' syllabus (see above).
 - ✓ Reproduction through evangelism and follow-up of his own babes.
- Elder (Leader of Disciple Makers)—because of his godly life and example, he is selected at this point to both:
 - ✓ Nurture and care for the young Christians, and
 - ✓ Help develop spiritual leadership for the Body of Christ.

The Syllabus

On the basis of the relationships in follow-up, the kinds of follow-up, and the stages of growth, we are able to write a specific syllabus for each stage and for each person we are helping. Some people will grow faster than others, so we may want to adjust the syllabus for each individual's needs. However, as we understand the objectives, we can tailor the specific program as God leads.

A group of people once asked Jesus how they could do the work of God. Jesus replied, "The work of God is this: to believe in the one He has sent" (John 6:29). God desires belief and faith from us, for "without faith it is impossible to please God" (Hebrews 11:6).

But often our "faith" is nothing more than wishful thinking—"I hope everything works out all right. I have 'faith' that it will." The biblical concept of faith far surpasses this superficial approach.





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BIBLE READING PROGRAM

Introduction

The Bible is God's revealed Word to men. Therefore, it is of utmost importance to discover what it says and obey it!

Many Christians confine their Bible reading to certain favorite portions and only when they feel the need. But the Scriptures declare, "The whole Bible was given by inspiration from God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives; it straightens us out and helps us do what is right. It is God's way of making us well-prepared at every point, fully equipped to do good to everyone" (2 Timothy 3:16,17, Living Bible).

Want to know a secret of the Apostle Paul's dynamic, fruitful life? Listen to his testimony, "This is why we never collapse. The outward man does indeed suffer wear and tear, but everyday the inward man receives fresh strength" (2 Corinthians 4:16, Phillips). To keep spiritually fit we need the whole Bible, and we need to feed our souls from it daily.

Bible reading helps us know Jesus Christ better. We learn most about Jesus in the New Testament, particularly the Gospels, but He is actually the theme of the entire Book. After His resurrection Jesus astounded two of His disciples by beginning at Moses and all the prophets (the Old Testament) and interpreting to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself (see Luke 24:27). Look for Jesus Christ throughout the Bible.

People are groping for purpose and meaning to life. But we have undermined the very foundation for purposeful living by substituting God's truth with humanistic speculations. The result is more and more people confused, frustrated and in despair. How assuring are the words of Jesus to His Father, "Thy Word is truth!" Yes, the Book is true. And it is absolutely trustworthy. Men's theories undergo constant change, but the Bible needs no alteration. It is the most up-to-date Book there is. It is anchored in historical events and invites honest investigation. You can unreservedly place your confidence in it.

Develop the habit of regular, consecutive Bible reading and meditation and mark your growth in spiritual vitality, joy, stability and usefulness.

The Plan

- 1. You will read the New Testament in one year, and you can read the Old Testament either in one or two years.
- 2. Check the appropriate squares when you have read the specified portions. If you follow the one-year plan you will check both outside columns for the Old Testament, but only the left column in the shaded New Testament area.
- 3. Don't fall behind in your reading. If you miss a day continue to read according to date and as soon as possible make up the missed passages.
- 4. The Old Testament books are read in the order in which they appear in the Bible. If you follow the one-year plan, you will read in two sections of the Old Testament each day, beginning with Genesis and Ezra.
- 5. In keeping with the object of knowing Christ, the reading of the four Gospels is spaced throughout the year.
- 6. You will read an average of 54 verses a day for the two-year plan and 86 verses for the one-year plan.

Bible Reading Quiet Time Program

In Chapter Ten our lesson was the Quiet Time and its importance in learning how to develop our own personal relationship to the Lord. At that time we introduced you to a very simple 31-day Quiet Time program, called Appointment With God. This program guided you through a series of different ways, or patterns, you could use in addressing a passage of Scripture. Last week you completed the Appointment With God series.

In this lesson you are introduced to a Bible Reading Program which allows you to use these passages of Scripture to guide you in developing your relationship with God. These Bible Reading charts will take you through the entire Bible in one or *two years*.

If you do not have some other Quiet Time reading program you are following, let me encourage you to let the Bible Reading Program become your guide for Quiet Time passages.

Introduction

The Great Commission will never be accomplished until every disciple is "fishing for men." In this lesson we will be teaching you how to present the Gospel of Jesus Christ to another person. The tool we use is called the **Bridge** illustration. We use the Socratic form of evangelism in which people are given basic information and then asked specific questions based on the information. This has proven to be a very effective method of presenting the Gospel for a number of reasons:

- It creates a deductive dialogue.
- To answer the questions people must **reason** from the information given.
- The answer establishes the premises from which we continue to reason.
- People tell you what you wanted to tell them.
- People discover the truth on their own rather than by your giving them the answers.
- You have immediate feedback on what people do and don't understand.
- The truth is visualized as you write the answer into the illustration.


You are asked to memorize the following sequence of questions. You need not memorize word for word as you would memorize a Bible verse. However, if you adjust the questions, make sure that the question extracts the answer you want. A sloppy question may extract the wrong answer and hinder rather than help you. Memorize the sequence of questions in bold print. The logical answers are printed in script. Both are printed together so you can see the flow of thought for the dialogue.

Gospel Presentation

A person must understand three things to become a Child of God or, in other words, a Christian. With your permission, I would like to show you from the Bible what these three things are. Okay, if it doesn't take too long, I have a few minutes.

The First Thing

The Bible records that God made Adam and Eve and placed them in the Garden of Eden with clear instructions about the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil. They lived in perfect harmony with God and had fellowship with Him.



One day however, something happened in the Garden that caused a barrier to be erected between them and their Creator so that they could no longer have fellowship with Him.


Can you tell me what that was?

Was this when they ate the fruit and disobeyed God?


Yes, Adam and Eve chose to listen to the serpent's reasoning rather than God's command. There is a special word the Bible uses for this disobedience. Do you know what the Bible calls it?

Was it sin?

That's right-it was sin.



We could illustrate this another way; we could put man standing on one side of a cliff, God on the other side and SIN in between, separating them.



The Bible talks about this in Romans 3:23.

Would you please read this passage to me?

"For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."

According to this passage, how many have sinned?

It says "all."


Does this mean I have sinned?

It says "all," so I guess that means you.

Does it mean that you, too, have sinned?

Yes, it means that I, too, have sinned.

Now that's the first thing a man must understand to become a Christian. Let's write that down.



The Second Thing

The second thing that a man must understand to become a Christian is found in Romans 6:23. Here the author draws a conclusion to this matter of sin.

Would you please read this passage to me?


"For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

God does not expect us to labor and make this world a better place to live without paying us a wage. God fully intends to pay us a wage for all that we have ever done.

However, here God says that the wage for our sin is what?

It says "death."

This is the second thing that a man must understand to become a Christian, so let's write that down.



We could say many things about death. But if we reduce it to its simplest form, it is mere separation. Several years ago, my father-in-law died. Now he is in one place and I am in another; death has separated us. When Adam and his wife sinned, they died spiritually and were separated from God.

The Third Thing

The third thing that a man must understand to become a Christian is found in Hebrews 9:27.


Would you please read this verse to me?

"And as it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment."

According to this verse, when a man dies he has an appointment with God, for what?

Judgment.

Since that is the third thing that a man must understand to become a Christian, let's write it down.




Now if it is true that all men have sinned, and that the penalty for sin is death and separation from God, and that the day is coming when man will be judged. This does not paint a very bright picture, does it?

No, it certainly does not.

Down through the ages, man has understood this and has tried to make his way back to God.

What are some ways you think men try to make their way back to God?

By living a good moral life? Being religious? Helping his fellow man?



You are right—this is how men try to make or work their way back to God. However, we learned in Romans 3:23 that all our efforts fall short of what God requires. In John 5:24, God reveals what is required. Here we learn three very interesting things that are relevant to what we have already learned.

I wonder if you would read this verse to me?

"Most assuredly, I say to you, he who hears My word and believes in Him who sent Me **has** everlasting life, and **shall** not come into judgment, but has **passed** from death into life."

Who's speaking?

I guess it's Jesus.

That's right-Jesus says that if you will hear His Words...

Are these my words or Jesus'?

Jesus'.

.And believe in Him who sent me...

Who sent Jesus?


God.

Three things would happen.

What are they?

- Has everlasting life
- Shall not face judgment
- ullet Passed from death to life

So let's write those down on the other side of the ravine.



Notice the tenses of the verbs in each of the above phrases.

In what tense is 'has"-past, future, or present?

Present tense.

What does the present tense in this statement mean?

It means that right now, in the present, I can have eternal life.

That's right. Now in what tense is "shall not"—present, past or future?

Future tense.

So what does this phrase mean?

I will not be judged at some future date.

That's right. Now in what tense is "passed" future, present or past?

Past tense.

And what does this phrase mean?


I have already passed from death into life.

That's right. It is important that you understand this because if you now have everlasting life, what does that do to death?

It crosses out death.

If you shall not be judged, what does that do to judgment?

It cancels judgment.



When I hear God calling and believe, that means:

- Intellectually I understand the facts of the Gospel;
- Emotionally I know and want to act on what I have heard;

• <u>Volitionally</u> I turn from man's side to God's side and place my faith in Jesus' finished work on the Cross for my sin.


This allows me to pass over to God's side. The Bible says:

God is on one side and all the people on the other; Jesus, Himself man, is between them to bring them together, by giving His life for all mankind.

1 Timothy 2:5 (LB)

For I delivered to you first of all that which I also received: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures...

1 Corinthians 15:3,4



If you were to place yourself into this illustration, where would you draw yourself?

I would place myself on man's side.

Is that where you want to be?

No.

Where do you want to be?

Over on God's side.

Do you know how to get there?

I'm not sure.

Let's look at John 1:12.

Will you read this verse to me?

"But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name."

What must a man do to become a Child of God?

He must receive "Him."

Must receive whom?

Jesus Christ.

Do you know how to receive Him?

I'm not sure.

Let's look at another verse in Revelation 3:20.

Will you read this to me?

"Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and dine with him, and he with Me."

Who is speaking?

Jesus.

What is He doing?

He is knocking at the door.

What door?

The door to man's heart and life.

Why is He knocking?

Because He wants to come in.

NOTES The way to receive Christ is to open the door of your heart and life and let Him in. To get from man's side to God's side, all you must do when we pray is repent of your sins, and ask God to do three things: • Forgive you for your sins. • Come into your life and help you to become the kind of person He created you to be. • Give you the gift of eternal life so that you might be with Him forever. I am going to ask you to pray these three things loud enough so that when you have finished I can say a prayer to God for you. Let's pray.




EQUIPPING THE SAINTS

FOLLOW-UP TOOLS FOR CONVERTS

Introduction

In the next two lessons we will translate follow-up philosophy into some practical tools and guides which will aid you as you help others grow to maturity in Christ. These tools and guides will aid you in the structured aspect of what to teach to your converts.



An extremely important part of the follow-up relationship is its recreational aspect. The new convert needs to see and experience how Christians can have fun without doing things that dishonor Christ or break His commandments.

A new convert who had lived a rather wild life prior to his conversion remarked, "The first time I went to a Christian function I thought, 'This isn't going to be much fun without liquor and dancing and making out with the girls.' At the end of the evening I was amazed at how much fun I had. Everything was clean and honoring to God, but I couldn't remember any function in recent years which had been more enjoyable. It was hard to believe that the Christians could have more fun than the non-Christians."

Ask God to give you a sanctified imagination as you work on the recreational aspect of follow-up.

Objective for New Convert

The *objective* is to help the new convert be established in a growing relationship with God. The key to this relationship is a strong healthy communication process which is accomplished by prayer and the Word of God.

This is beautifully illustrated for us in what we call the **Wheel Illustration**. The *vertical spokes* illustrate this communication process. *Through prayer*, the convert is able to express to God both the thoughts he is thinking and the things he is feeling. *Through the Word*, God has very carefully expressed both His instructions to us and His feelings for us. The hub, which deals with our personal relationship with God, allows this communication to take place.

The Hub of the Wheel



The source of power to drive the wheel comes from the hub of the wheel. Once Christ comes to live in us, He provides the source of power.

"But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."

Acts 1:8

The Holy Spirit is God's helper in helping us to build a strong, growing relationship with God. Without His guidance and help, the convert will never be established in his walk with God. The Holy Spirit also dwells in us and is our *source* of comfort.

And I will pray the Father, and **He shall give you** another Comforter, that he may abide with you for ever.

John 14:16 (KJV)

The Holy Spirit instructs us in all we need to know and calls the truth of Scripture to our conscious memory.

"But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, **He will teach you all** things, and bring to your remembrance all things that I said to you."

John 14:26

It is only by careful help from the Spirit of God, that we will find the power to overcome the enemy. Satan is a faithful enemy who will do everything in his power to neutralize or destroy our relationship with God.

Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour.

1 Peter 5:8

The key to the convert's growth in his new relationship with God is the **Word of God** and **Prayer**. These two elements establish the **vertical spokes** of the wheel.

Vertical Spokes—



Prayer

Prayer is the means by which God allows us to communicate with Him. Strong healthy relationships are established through communications. If a convert is to build his relationship with God, then the two of them must learn to talk together. If there is to be fellowship that God created us for, we must learn to communicate with Him.

Learning about God's grace, expressed by His love for us, makes it almost impossible for new converts to remain silent.

In my own experience, there were so many things I wanted to communicate to Him. I wanted to tell Him:

- How much I loved Him and appreciated what He had done to obtain my salvation.
- How sorry I was for ignoring Him for so many years of my life.
- How sorry I was for my sins and rebellion against the commandments which I so willfully violated.
- How I desired to turn my life around and live in accordance with His commandments.
- That I needed help and guidance, as well as power and strength, to direct my life to His will for me.
- That I was afraid of disappointing Him by not being able to live up to the principles of the Bible.
- How grateful I was that for all eternity I would live with Him in Heaven.
- To "Thank Him," for sending Jesus to die for my sins.



The Word

It is *hard* to build a relationship without creating a dialogue. God did this when He used some forty different people over a period of some 1,500 years to reveal to us the things that were upon His heart.

God chose to reveal His Word to us through the Holy Bible. This book is God's "love letter" to us, His children. Here, He reveals all that

He wants us to know about Himself. Not only are we given careful instruction about where we came from, but we are also given instruction about the present conflicts in which we daily find ourselves.

God, in His Word


- Declares His love for us, and lets us know how deeply He cares for us.
- Tells us about our sin after Satan had deceived Adam and Eve in the Garden, and about His plan to rescue us from our sins.
- Assures us that Christ's blood has paid the penalty for all our sins—both past and future.
- Warns us about Satan, our faithful present enemy, and gives us instruction on how we can overcome him.
- Assures us that He is dwelling in us and empowering us to live in obedience.
- Tells us that He understands our struggle with sin and the propensity for our fallen bodies to be drawn to our old sinful nature.
- Reminds us of our brothers and sisters who have gone before us, and their struggle to overcome the enemy in their lives.
- Tells us that He is in absolute sovereign control over every situation that is allowed to touch our lives, and that if we keep our eyes on Him He will bring us through—whatever the situation.
- Assures that we will be together with Him throughout eternity.

By spending time daily in His Word, God guides us in doctrine, reproves us when we are contemplating the wrong path, puts us back on the right path if we stray, and instructs us to the path that is His will for our lives.

Communication is the key to a strong relationship. In the presence of such loving dialogue between the convert and God, it is hard for the devil to interfere. It is when a person is not helped to develop this kind of relationship that Satan has such a destructive force on the relationship. The new convert continues to drown in a sea of fear and despair. The Gospel's good news alone can deliver him from such hopelessness. Therefore, once the principle of the "Hub" is established in the life of the convert, through the Word and through prayer, he is able to turn his life around.

The Gospel

It is also of extreme importance that the person understands the Gospel message. If a person doesn't fully understand the simple truths of the Gospel, Satan is standing ready to steal these truths away. So go over the *Bridge Illustration* until you are *sure* the person understands. The memory verses which you have just memorized in lessons 2/7-2/12 will help you to make the Gospel clear. See verses illustrated below.



- All Have Sinned—Romans 3:23 and Isaiah 53:6
- Sin's Penalty—Romans 6:23 and Hebrews 9:27
- Christ Paid the Penalty—Romans 5:8 and 1 Peter 3:18
- Salvation Not by Works—Ephesians 2:8,9 and Titus 3:5
- Must Receive Christ—John 1:12 and Revelation 3:20
- Assurance of Salvation—1 John 5:13 and John 5:24

Assurance of Salvation

Every person needs to walk away from his or her salvation experience having received assurance that the penalty for sin has been paid. People need the assurance that if life were to end now, they would wake up to spend eternity in Heaven with God forever. They need to know that salvation is by the grace of God alone. God bestowed this unmerited favor on us because of His love for us. God's grace is of real importance because most people have been trying to work their way to Heaven—something which no one will ever be able to do.

For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast.

Ephesians 2:8,9

The Gospel is "good news" when people realize that *they will not* receive what they deserve! Because of sin, each person deserves to be separated from God in a place called hell, but because of God's grace expressed in His love, believers are now on their way to an eternity with God. Heaven is the undeserved gift of God through Christ's sacrifice for sin upon the Cross. This assurance changes our motivation from a negative one of fear of death to a positive one of love and gratitude to God.

And this is the testimony: that God has given us eternal life, and this life is in His Son. He who has the Son has life; he who does not have the Son of God does not have life. These things I have written to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, that you may know that you have eternal life, and that you may continue to believe in the name of the Son of God.

I John 5:11-13

The good works, which we have been saved to do, are now done as we respond back to God in love rather than fear.

Getting Started

When you meet with the convert, review his conversion experience. Help the person to understand that, as a result of receiving Christ as Savior, he can now be sure that he has eternal life.

In our teaching we must: Tell him why, show him how, get him started, keep him going, and get him started reproducing.

Assurance Lessons and Memory Verses

Go over the Assurance lessons and make sure the convert understands. Ask questions on the verse we discussed from the lesson; if the convert can answer correctly, understanding is taking place.

The first five Bible Studies used in the follow-up program are called "Lessons on Assurance." They are printed by NavPress, and can be found in most Christian bookstores. Since you don't want to use an ETS Book One on someone you are not sure of, it is best to buy the Lesson on Assurances for \$2.50 along with the book called Beginning with Christ for \$1.00. This has the accompanying five verses to go with the Bible Studies, with a short commentary on each verse. If your convert does the five Bible Study lessons and the five memory verses, you may want to get an ETS Book One for him. Careful examination of the first five ETS Convert Application Guides will reveal these are the same Bible Studies and memory verses used in the ETS Follow-Up Guide.

The next eight Bible Studies also come from the NavPress series called *Lessons on Christian Living* for \$2.50 and the accompanying verses are called *Going on With Christ* for \$1.00. You may buy a book called *Growing in Christ* for \$4.99 which contains the same thirteen Bible Studies and memory verses. You can use the lesson from your own book to complete the material needed for the Convert Application Guide.

Go over 1 John 5:11-13 phrase by phrase. Help your disciple see why this is such an important verse, and help him memorize it. Show him how the first Bible Study lesson in *Lessons on Assurance* goes with the memory verse. Do the first few questions with him so he can see how to do the study and find the verses himself. Make an appointment within the next week and discuss the Bible Study in detail in its completed form.



Remember: Satan is going to work overtime to make sure the verse never gets memorized or the study done. Explain that Satan will try to stop this and emphasize the need to make these things priorities. Tell him you will call to see how he is doing and ask when is the best time.

When you call, you may invite him to your first recreational event. This will help him see that the Christian life is not all work.

Now that you have him started, keep him going. Work step-by-step through the guide. Each time you meet, end with prayer and some fun activity such as ice cream and coffee or popcorn and coke. Ask God to help you demonstrate love and appreciation for your relationship with the new convert in Christ. Remember you are setting the pace for how he will one day follow-through on his own spiritual children.

Objectives for Discipleship Material

To get the person started growing in Christ he must—

- Memorize the five verses on assurance.
- Study what the Bible teaches about the five assurances.
- Have a daily devotional program.

Plan for Use of Discipleship Materials

- Introduce the materials.
- Discuss why it is important for him to do the assignments.
- Motivate him to start today.
- Help him to get started.
- Make a specific appointment to go over his progress.
- Keep him going until you have completed the ETS Convert Guide.

Tools Needed for the Convert Guide

Follow-up is done by someONE, not someTHING. However, the person doing the follow-up will be aided if he has some tools to help him.

Most people need some kind of tools to do their work. The doctor needs his stethoscope. The accountant needs his calculator. The engineer needs his slide rule, and the person doing follow-up needs his Bible and some materials which will help him do the task. It isn't that we can't function without materials, but without them our task would be more difficult. Basically, tools help us to do our job **efficiently**, **effectively**, **and systematically**.

ETS Convert Guide Follow-Up System

A follow-up guide for a new Christian is built into your *ETS* training. On the back of each *Disciple Application Guide*, you will find a *Convert Application Guide* which will instruct you with what to cover each week. This guide reminds you in which lesson the various tools can be found. All you need to do is rearrange those materials and use them to guide you as you help your convert grow into a disciple.

The Convert Application Guide directs you to remove the various tools from the lessons indicated by the numbers and incorporate them into the Convert configuration.

In the second week for a new convert, the subject is prayer. Again the outline explains where the material is found. *ETS* material is the same for a new convert as for a more mature Christian; the difference is simply the order in which the lessons are covered.

Sometimes it may seem to you that God's will is hidden in a buried treasure chest and you have only small portions of the map to find it. But is this true? Is God keeping His plans from you as some hidden secret? Or will He allow you to follow Him, and lead you step by step?

Proverbs 3:5,6 can clear up misconceptions about knowing God's will. Meditate on it carefully:

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make your paths straight."



A ONE YEAR BIBLE READING PROGRAM

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BIBLE READING PROGRAM

Introduction

The Bible is God's revealed Word to men. Therefore, it is of utmost importance to discover what it says and obey it!

Many Christians confine their Bible reading to certain favorite portions and only when they feel the need. But the Scriptures declare, "The whole Bible was given by inspiration from God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives; it straightens us out and helps us do what is right. It is God's way of making us well-prepared at every point, fully equipped to do good to everyone" (2 Timothy 3:16,17, Living Bible).

Want to know a secret of the Apostle Paul's dynamic, fruitful life? Listen to his testimony, "This is why we never collapse. The outward man does indeed suffer wear and tear, but everyday the inward man receives fresh strength" (2 Corinthians 4:16, Phillips). To keep spiritually fit we need the whole Bible, and we need to feed our souls from it daily.

Bible reading helps us know Jesus Christ better. We learn most about Jesus in the New Testament, particularly the Gospels, but He is actually the theme of the entire Book. After His resurrection Jesus astounded two of His disciples by beginning at Moses and all the prophets (the Old Testament) and interpreting to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself (see Luke 24:27). Look for Jesus Christ throughout the Bible.

People are groping for purpose and meaning to life. But we have undermined the very foundation for purposeful living by substituting God's truth with humanistic speculations. The result is more and more people confused, frustrated and in despair. How assuring are the words of Jesus to His Father, "Thy Word is truth!" Yes, the Book is true. And it is absolutely trustworthy. Men's theories undergo constant change, but the Bible needs no alteration. It is the most up-to-date Book there is. It is anchored in historical events and invites honest investigation. You can unreservedly place your confidence in it.

Develop the habit of regular, consecutive Bible reading and meditation and mark your growth in spiritual vitality, joy, stability and usefulness.

The Plan

- 1. You will read the New Testament in one year, and you can read the Old Testament either in one or two years.
- 2. Check the appropriate squares when you have read the specified portions. If you follow the one-year plan you will check both outside columns for the Old Testament, but only the left column in the shaded New Testament area.
- 3. Don't fall behind in your reading. If you miss a day continue to read according to date and as soon as possible make up the missed passages.
- 4. The Old Testament books are read in the order in which they appear in the Bible. If you follow the one-year plan, you will read in two sections of the Old Testament each day, beginning with Genesis and Ezra.
- 5. In keeping with the object of knowing Christ, the reading of the four Gospels is spaced throughout the year.
- 6. You will read an average of 54 verses a day for the two-year plan and 86 verses for the one-year plan.

Bible Reading Quiet Time Program

In Chapter Ten our lesson was the Quiet Time and its importance in learning how to develop our own personal relationship to the Lord. At that time we introduced you to a very simple 31-day Quiet Time program, called Appointment With God. This program guided you through a series of different ways, or patterns, you could use in addressing a passage of Scripture. Last week you completed the Appointment With God series.

In this lesson you are introduced to a Bible Reading Program which allows you to use these passages of Scripture to guide you in developing your relationship with God. These Bible Reading charts will take you through the entire Bible in one or *two years*.

If you do not have some other Quiet Time reading program you are following, let me encourage you to let the Bible Reading Program become your guide for Quiet Time passages.







Introduction

Once a convert is established in a growing relationship with God and has completed the *Convert Follow-Up Guide*, he or she advances to the *Disciple Follow-Up Guide*. The *Convert Follow-Up Guide* focused on growth through the hub and vertical spokes of the wheel; the *Disciple Follow-Up Guide* focuses on the *horizontal* spokes.



As the convert matures and focuses only on the vertical spokes of the wheel, he will find his life out of balance. We, as disciple leaders, must now work to balance the *vertical and the horizontal* aspects of the wheel and thus bring an equilibrium to his spiritual life.

In the early stages of the convert's new walk with God, he is normally highly motivated to share with others what God has done and is doing in his life. As quickly as possible, he must begin reaching out to family and friends.

Objective for Disciples

The *objective* is to help the disciple understand his individual commitment and responsibility to the Great Commission and its fulfilling requires a life *devoted* to disciplemaking, which begins with the winning of lost people.

The four basic components dealing with this objective help bring about: the horizontal reality of ministry, the importance of making Jesus Lord; developing evangelism and a desire to fish for lost people; making of disciples; and living a life of service with the local church. Each of these four components will be discussed within this chapter. By focusing on them, we can help a convert to become a disciple who is actively engaged in the fulfillment of Christ's Great Commission.

Making Jesus Lord

When a person invites Jesus into his life, the hub of the wheel is established. In the *New Covenant Relationship*, the Spirit of God doesn't dwell in a building, but in the temple of the believer's life.

Often, when a convert asks Christ to indwell his life, it is with the initial understanding that Christ is to act only as a co-pilot, assisting the new believer in doing a better job with his life. The convert realizes that he is not living up to God's expectations and needs the help of the Holy Spirit. Through continued reading and studying of the Word of God, he begins to realize that Jesus didn't come into his heart to be a co-pilot—He came to be the pilot, or Lord, of his life. The convert soon realizes that Jesus can't sit on his lap, and he can't sit on Jesus' lap—there simply isn't room in the pilot's seat for two people. Christ is the only one capable of acting as pilot. The only way to allow Christ to be the pilot is for the convert to surrender the pilot's seat into the Lord's hands so that He may navigate him into God's perfect will for his life.

This means he must turn over the controls of his life to Jesus. He must humble himself, swallow his pride, admit he cannot do it on his own, declare spiritual bankruptcy, and abdicate the throne of his life to the Lord's hands. This transforms the hub of his will into the Lord's throne room from which Christ may direct his life. It is only when this total surrender is made that a disciple will find the true joy and peace he has longed and searched for.

The unholy trinity of Me, Myself and I must be replaced by a Holy Trinity—the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Or do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own? For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's.

1 Corinthians 6:19,20



Becoming a Fisher of Men



Next, the new convert must become active in evangelism. **Evangelism** is the means by which we share the Gospel of Jesus Christ with lost people. One of the reasons that God doesn't take us to Heaven once we are saved from our sins is because He wants to use us to spread the message to our lost friends.

"But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."

Acts 1:8

Then Jesus said to them again, "Peace to you! As the Father has sent Me, I also send you."

John 20:21

And He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature."

Mark 16:15

Let the redeemed of the LORD say so, Whom He has redeemed from the hand of the enemy.

One major emphases of the *ETS* training has to do with the Gospel message and learning to present it effectively. Our main objective with the new convert was to ensure that there was a clear understanding of the message. As a disciple, that objective begins to focus on teaching the convert how to share the message by using the Socratic form of the Bridge Illustration, found in Lesson 1/7. In Lesson 1/8, the convert is taught how to open and control a conversation. Once in control of the conversation, he is in a position of sharing the Bridge with a non-Christian. This method of evangelism is taught in class by way of memorizing these tools and practicing them on one another until the convert has gained confidence in his ability to share these truths effectively.

Learning to Make Disciples

This last horizontal spoke is called discipleship. Some groups have called this spoke "fellowship" because the fellowship of the early New Testament Church produced the disciples that they were commanded to make in the Great Commission.

Then those who gladly received his word were baptized; and that day about three thousand souls were added to them.

Acts 2:41

We see in Acts 2:41 that 3,000 were converted to Christ on the Day of Pentecost, just ten days after Jesus ascended into Heaven. Just prior to His ascension, Jesus gave the eleven the Great Commission. The book of Matthew reveals that the imperative of this commission is the act of making of disciples. This was to be the "marching orders" of the church. The first step to discipleship was the proclamation of the Gospel, so that people would repent of their sins and place their hope of salvation in Jesus' atoning work on the cross.

Let the redeemed of the LORD say so, Whom He has redeemed from the hand of the enemy.

Psalm 107:2

This made them converts and born-again believers in Jesus Christ, but the imperative was to **make disciples**.

It should be noted that nowhere in the pages of Scripture are we ever commanded to make converts. Therefore, it is of little wonder that Acts 2:42 tells us:

And they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers.

Acts 2:42

They were *steadfast in four basic components* of making disciples:

Fellowship

Fellowship was designed to help these young converts become what Jesus had commanded the eleven to make—disciples. The verse is very clear as to the *content* of the fellowship that transforms a convert into a disciple.

Apostles' Doctrine

Matthew 28:20—"Teach them to **observe** (**obey**) all things whatsoever I have commanded you." The eleven were teaching the 3,000 all the things that Jesus had once taught. Not only were they dependent upon the Holy Spirit to remind them all that Jesus had taught them, but they were also dependent upon Him to bring conviction to the converts about these truths.

Breaking of the Bread

This refers to the celebration of the Lord's Supper, or Communion, which we are told about in the Gospel record and taught to practice in Paul's instruction to the Corinthian Church.

Prayer

Prayer gave the new believers the opportunity to interact with God over the things which He was commanding them to do. This dialogue brought about clarification, as well as convictions and obedience on the part of these new converts who were being equipped to become disciples of Jesus Christ.

This point of "learning to make disciples" has been belabored because the fellowship of many churches doesn't produce disciples. They are producing people who sit in the pews on Sunday professing Christianity, but fail to practice it in their daily lives. The wheel that we are trying to produce into the life of the disciple makes the disciple a part of the solution and not a part of the continuing problem plaguing the 20th century church.

When the hub and the spokes function in harmony, this brings the rim of obedience into a reality. Biblical disciples are actively involved in personal vertical growth in their own lives, balanced by a horizontal ministry of winning the lost and equipping the disciples for growth and service.



Serving in the Body

Jesus was very clear about His objective and purpose for this short vapor called "life."

"For I have come down from heaven, not to do My own will, but the will of Him who sent Me."

John 6:38

Jesus realized that He was on a mission with very strategic objectives to accomplish. As God's servant, He gave Himself wholeheartedly to the fulfilling of the task. As His disciples, we must also realize that Jesus has left us with a very specific objective—the Great Commission.

Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus, who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God, but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a servant, and coming in the likeness of men.

Philippians 2:5-7

For we do not preach ourselves, but Christ Jesus the Lord, and ourselves your servants for Jesus' sake.

2 Corinthians 4:5

"You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit, and that your fruit should remain, that whatever you ask the Father in My name He may give you."

John 15:16

The marching orders are very clear—each disciple should be fruitful in winning the lost and the making of disciples. In the New Testament Church, *every* believer is a priest. This we have examined very carefully in Lesson 1/3—*The Priesthood of Every Believer*.

As a disciple of Jesus, being a priest is our vocational calling and purpose in life. In God's plan, there is a place of service to which God has assigned each of us. Jesus was very concerned that He not do His own will, but that He find God's will and do it. We must also give consideration to God's will and His place of service for us. Someday, each of us will be called upon to account for the stewardship of our lives in light of God's will for us. Jesus tell us that there will be conflict if we try to serve two masters. A mature disciple comes to understand that his vocation is a priest, and his avocation has more to do with where he carries out his priestly function. So, whatever we do, or where we spend time in terms of employment, this is the place where we are called by God to carry out priestly function. With this clear understanding, we are not in conflict by trying to do what Jesus says is

impossible—serve two masters. We can now serve one master by being His priest in our homes, neighborhoods, places of employment and local churches.

God has beautifully scattered His discipling priests throughout the community so that every lost person will be surrounded by a sea of priests.

Practical Suggestions

Now that you have the person started and have completed the "Convert Follow-Up Guide," keep him going by following the *ETS* "Disciple Follow-Up Guide." It will take nine or ten months to a year to successfully complete all the areas listed in the guide.

With this guide you will need to employ all four of the relationships: recreational, structured, casual, and partnership. Many of the activities can be done in a group, but as the person matures and develops, you will want to spend more casual face-to-face time with him, getting to know him as an individual and trying to help him with his areas of struggle and need. As he learns how to share his faith and develops his testimony, you will want to team up in some partnership evangelism. He will learn more by watching you and by being drawn into your ministry than by anything else.

The guide will help you in the structured aspect of the training, but you will need to develop the recreational aspect. Find out what he likes to do and enter into it if possible. Remember not to let the fun and games fall by the wayside. It is important that the person sees the fun and excitement of the Christian life.


Following this lesson you will find a *Disciple's Follow-Up Guide*. This guide covers the elements that will help your convert continue to develop into a mature, functioning disciple, and will direct you to tools encompassed within the *ETS* materials. The suggestions and ideas given on each item will help you to turn the various objectives into realities. Check off each item upon completion.

Disciple Application Guide

Once you have completed the *Convert Application Guides* in Books One and Two, continue by using the *Disciples Application Guides* in Books Three and Four. They will guide you step-by-step through the materials and tools which are designed to help you in your own personal growth as well as assist you in what to do with your disciple. At this key stage of growth, your disciple must become fruitful in

evangelism and disciplemaking. Once the disciple has been taught what to do, the guide forces accountability for application, but it will be *your responsibility* to maintain that accountability. If you let the disciple audit the ministry part of this course, you are not helping him, you don't serve God, you don't serve your disciple, and you don't serve yourself. You allow yourself to become a part of the problem, rather than the solution.

In the beginning, evangelism and discipling can be a very scary undertaking. Many feel inadequate or lack the vision to obey and become fishers of men and disciple others. It is not easy to find role models within the church. It seems like there is only a small number who will not settle for sterility, and push on to become fruitful in this area of life and ministry. God is trying to enlist an army of dedicated disciples around the world who will provide this kind of leadership and to set forth a new role model. Trust God to give you courage and wisdom to become this kind of pacesetter for your convert or disciple.



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BIBLE READING PROGRAM

Introduction

The Bible is God's revealed Word to men. Therefore, it is of utmost importance to discover what it says and obey it!

Many Christians confine their Bible reading to certain favorite portions and only when they feel the need. But the Scriptures declare, "The whole Bible was given by inspiration from God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives; it straightens us out and helps us do what is right. It is God's way of making us well-prepared at every point, fully equipped to do good to everyone" (2 Timothy 3:16,17, Living Bible).

Want to know a secret of the Apostle Paul's dynamic, fruitful life? Listen to his testimony, "This is why we never collapse. The outward man does indeed suffer wear and tear, but everyday the inward man receives fresh strength" (2 Corinthians 4:16, Phillips). To keep spiritually fit we need the whole Bible, and we need to feed our souls from it daily.

Bible reading helps us know Jesus Christ better. We learn most about Jesus in the New Testament, particularly the Gospels, but He is actually the theme of the entire Book. After His resurrection Jesus astounded two of His disciples by beginning at Moses and all the prophets (the Old Testament) and interpreting to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself (see Luke 24:27). Look for Jesus Christ throughout the Bible.

People are groping for purpose and meaning to life. But we have undermined the very foundation for purposeful living by substituting God's truth with humanistic speculations. The result is more and more people confused, frustrated and in despair. How assuring are the words of Jesus to His Father, "Thy Word is truth!" Yes, the Book is true. And it is absolutely trustworthy. Men's theories undergo constant change, but the Bible needs no alteration. It is the most up-to-date Book there is. It is anchored in historical events and invites honest investigation. You can unreservedly place your confidence in it.

Develop the habit of regular, consecutive Bible reading and meditation and mark your growth in spiritual vitality, joy, stability and usefulness.

The Plan

- 1. You will read the New Testament in one year, and you can read the Old Testament either in one or two years.
- 2. Check the appropriate squares when you have read the specified portions. If you follow the one-year plan you will check both outside columns for the Old Testament, but only the left column in the shaded New Testament area.
- 3. Don't fall behind in your reading. If you miss a day continue to read according to date and as soon as possible make up the missed passages.
- 4. The Old Testament books are read in the order in which they appear in the Bible. If you follow the one-year plan, you will read in two sections of the Old Testament each day, beginning with Genesis and Ezra.
- 5. In keeping with the object of knowing Christ, the reading of the four Gospels is spaced throughout the year.
- 6. You will read an average of 54 verses a day for the two-year plan and 86 verses for the one-year plan.

Bible Reading Quiet Time Program

In Chapter Ten our lesson was the Quiet Time and its importance in learning how to develop our own personal relationship to the Lord. At that time we introduced you to a very simple 31-day Quiet Time program, called Appointment With God. This program guided you through a series of different ways, or patterns, you could use in addressing a passage of Scripture. Last week you completed the Appointment With God series.

In this lesson you are introduced to a Bible Reading Program which allows you to use these passages of Scripture to guide you in developing your relationship with God. These Bible Reading charts will take you through the entire Bible in one or *two years*.

If you do not have some other Quiet Time reading program you are following, let me encourage you to let the Bible Reading Program become your guide for Quiet Time passages.





Introduction

God has not only made men stewards in the management of time; He has also made us stewards in the management of material resources. From the beginning, God has delighted in bestowing rich gifts upon His children. He placed Adam and Eve in a garden filled with delightful resources, and He placed them in authority over all the rest of creation. Before sin entered into the world, Adam and Eve had no problem being good stewards of God's resources. However, Satan deceived the woman into thinking that God really did not want to give the best to her. He convinced her that God was withholding something from her. In an attempt to gain *something* she thought would satisfy her, she took of the forbidden fruit and plunged mankind into a hopeless dilemma in which the very *things* that God wanted to give as gifts to man suddenly replaced God in their hearts.

Dr. A. W. Tozer, in dealing with this problem in his book, *Pursuit of God*, says that this is the "Heart of the Problem."

The Heart of the Problem

In his book, A. W. Tozer says that possessions and things are the source of sin and rebellion.

"Before the Lord God made man upon the earth, He first prepared for Him by creating a world of useful and pleasant things for his subsistence and delight. In the Genesis account of creation they were simply called "things." They were made for man's use but they were meant to be external to man and subservient to Him. In the deep heart of man was a shrine where none but God was worthy to come. Within him was God; without, a thousand gifts which God had showered upon him."

"But sin introduced complications and made those very gifts of God a potential source of ruin to the soul. Our woes began when God was forced out of His central shrine and things were allowed to enter. Within the human heart things had taken over. God's gifts now take the place of God and the whole course of nature is upset by the monstrous substitu-

tion. Now the heart covets things and not God. This is what sin is all about. We rebel against God and worship what He has created rather than rebelling against things and worshipping Him."

The Heart of the Solution

Our attitude reveals the condition of our heart and tells us who is really in control of our life. The very nature of sinful man is **possessive**—he wants to **possess** and **get**.

Whoever loves money never has money enough; whoever loves wealth is not satisfied with his income...

Ecclesiastes 5:10 (NIV)

Then He spoke a parable to them, saying: "The ground of a certain rich man yielded plentifully. And he thought within himself, saying, 'What shall I do, since I have no room to store my crops?' So he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build greater, and there I will store all my crops and my goods. And I will say to my soul, "Soul, you have many goods laid up for many years; take your ease; eat, drink, and be merry."'But God said to him, "You fool! This night your soul will be required of you; then whose will those things be which you have provided?" So is he who lays up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God.

Luke 12:16-21

When the Spirit of God invades our lives, He begins to control and change us. Our entire value system is changed to reflect the nature of God, which is to *give*.

For God so loved the world that He **gave** His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.

John 3:16

He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all, how shall He not with Him also freely give us all things?

Romans 8:32

Example of Christ

As long as Christ is Lord of our lives, His giving character can flow through us. He wants us to be living examples to the materialistic world that there is a better value system to employ.

Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break through and steal, but store up for yourselves treasure in heaven where moth and rust do not destroy and where thieves do not break in and steal.

Matthew 6:19,20 (NIV)

Give and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you.

Luke 6:38 (NIV)

Commenting on the widow's offering, Jesus said:

...I tell you the truth, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. They all gave out of their wealth, but she, out of her poverty put in everything—all she had to live on.

Mark 12:43,44 (NIV)

Jesus revolutionizes a person's value system when He is on the throne of the heart. He says:

- Money and material things are temporal.
- Treasure should be stored in Heaven.
- God tells us how to accumulate treasure in Heaven.
- God will bless the one who gives generously to God.

Jesus can free you from bondage to materialism!

Principles for Maintaining God's Perspective

If we really desire Christ to be Lord of our lives and to give us His perspective on material resources, we then need to look to the Scriptures for guidance. The Bible gives us several basic principles regarding possessions and things which can be of immense help to us in looking at material resources from God's point of view.

God Owns Everything

Many people fall into the mistaken notion that material and natural resources are theirs. This is untrue. They all belong to God. He was the One who was there when there was nothing else, and it was through His power and authority that everything else came into existence. Simply because He is the Creator God, all things belong to Him—including people themselves.

In the beginning God created...

Genesis 1:1

The earth is the Lord's, and all its fullness, the world and those who dwell therein.

Psalms 24:1

The silver is Mine, and the gold is Mine, says the LORD of hosts.

Haggai 2:8

For every beast of the forest is Mine, And the cattle on a thousand hills. I know all the birds of the mountains, And the wild beasts of the field are Mine.

Psalms 50:10,11

Or do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own? For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's.

1 Corinthians 6:19,20

God Gave Us What We Have

We are not self-made. Because God created us, He is the One who gave us the abilities and gifts that we have and the strength and health to use them profitably. Without His generosity and help, we should be incapable of acquiring anything.

...And what do you have that you did not receive? But if you did receive it, why do you boast as if you had not received it?

God warns us to avoid the fallacy of thinking that WE have accomplished or attained something independently of Him.

Then you say in your heart, 'My power and the might of my hand have gained me this wealth.' And you shall remember the LORD your God, for it is He who gives you power to get wealth, that He may establish His covenant which He swore to your fathers, as it is this day.

Deuteronomy 8:17,18

God Provides if We will Serve Him

When God created man, He placed him in a Paradise where every provision was made for him.

Then the LORD God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to tend and keep it. And the LORD God commanded the man, saying, "Of every tree of the garden you may freely eat..."

Genesis 2:15,16

When sin entered into the world, however, man was forced to provide for himself by the sweat of his own toil.

Then to Adam He said, "Because you have heeded the voice of your wife, and have eaten from the tree of which I commanded you, saying, 'You shall not eat of it': Cursed is the ground for your sake; in toil you shall eat of it all the days of your life. Both thorns and thistles it shall bring forth for you, and you shall eat the herb of the field. In the sweat of your face you shall eat bread till you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; for dust you are, and to dust you shall return."

Genesis 3:17-19

When Jesus entered into the world, He said that if men would again put God first in their lives, submitting to His Lordship, God would assume the responsibility for providing their every need.

But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and ALL THESE THINGS (material and physical needs) shall be added to you.

Matthew 6:33

And God is able to make all grace abound toward you, that you, always having all sufficiency in all things, have an abundance for every good work.

2 Corinthians 9:8

And my God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:19

We don't **have** to serve two masters because God has *promised* to provide.

These very promises are some of the most exciting ones in the Bible to experience. Many Christians forfeit the joy of seeing God supply their needs because they are constantly and frantically trying to supply them all themselves.

We Are to be Stewards of His Resources

Definition: A *steward* is one who has been entrusted with the responsibility of caring for the resources of another.

God's intention is that we use His resources and gifts for the building of His Kingdom.

As each one has received a gift, minister it to one another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.

1 Peter 4:10

Qualities of a Steward:

Faithful

Moreover it is required in stewards that one be found faithful.

1 Corinthians 4:2

Wise

So the master commended the unjust steward because he had dealt shrewdly...

Luke 16:8

Blameless

For a bishop must be blameless, as a steward of God, not self-willed, not quick-tempered, not given to wine, not violent, not greedy for money...

Titus 1:7

Accountable

And He also said to His disciples: "There was a certain rich man who had a steward, and an accusa-

tion was brought to him that this man was wasting his goods. So he called him and said to him, 'What is this I hear about you? Give an account of your stewardship, for you can no longer be steward.'"

Luke 16:1,2

God's Instructions to Stewards

Just as God gave specific instructions to Adam and Eve in the garden to keep them from sin, so God has also given us specific instructions to keep us from becoming ensnared financially. These instructions concern:

Earning-Spending / Saving-Hoarding-Giving

Earning

 Man is to work and provide for his family by the sweat of his labor.

In the sweat of your face you shall eat bread till you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; for dust you are, and to dust you shall return.

Genesis 3:19

• We are commanded to work six days of each week.

Six days you shall labor and do all your work... Exodus 20:9

• Idle men suffer hunger.

Slothfulness casts one into a deep sleep, and an idle person will suffer hunger.

Proverbs 19:15

• If any man would not work, neither should he eat.

For even when we were with you, we commanded you this: If anyone will not work, neither shall he eat.

2 Thessalonians 3:10

In some countries, governments have helped men to violate this by welfare programs that are too easy and do not require people to work. One of the ways God provides for man is by giving him the ability to work. By not requiring able-bodied persons to do what they can, governments are not exercising charity, but are destroying people's self image and dignity.

• We are to earn honestly.

He who profits illicitly troubles his own house. But he who hates bribes will live.

Proverbs 15:27 (NASV)

We are to work for our needs and not steal.

You shalt not steal.

Exodus 20:15

A man is to provide for his own—the wife is not to be the provider. The wife must learn to be happy with the husband's provision.

But if anyone does not provide for his own, and especially for those of his household, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever.

1 Timothy 5:8

Spending-Saving

Tithe first

The purpose of tithing is to teach you always to put God first.

You must tithe all of your crops every year. Bring this tithe to eat before the Lord your God at the place He shall choose as His sanctuary; this applies to your tithe of grain, new wine, olive oil, and the firstborn of your flocks and herds. The purpose of tithing is to teach you always to put God first in your lives.

Deuteronomy 14:22,23 (LB)

Honor the LORD with your possessions, and with the firstfruits of all your increase; so your barns will be filled with plenty, and your vats will overflow with new wine.

Proverbs 3:9,10

Stay out of debt

It is poor judgment to counter-sign another's note to become responsible for his debts.

Proverbs 17:18 (LB)

Just as the rich rule the poor, so the borrower is slave to the lender.

Proverbs 22:7 (LB)

Pay all your debts except the debt of love for others never finish paying that! For if you love them, you will be obeying all of God's laws, fulfilling all His requirements.

Romans 13:8 (LB)

Stay away from credit buying! Develop a habit of paying cash for most of your shopping. When you are paying with cash, it is easier to keep track of how much you are spending.

The man in debt is enslaved to his creditors and is unavailable to God in mobility and flexibility.

Save Systematically and Invest Wisely

The wise saves for the future but the foolish spends whatever he gets.

Proverbs 21:20 (LB)

Take a lesson from the ants, you lazy fellow. Learn from their ways and be wise. For though they have no king to make them work, yet they labor hard all summer, gathering food for the winter.

Proverbs 6:6-8 (LB)

Practical Advice on Saving

Pay Yourself First,

or you will find yourself supporting only the grocer, doctor, utility company, etc.

Make Wise Investments

Example:

If a man saves \$1,000 per year for 5 years at 12% interest, he will have at the end of that period—not \$5,000—but \$7,114.00. If he continues this program for a total of 20 years he would have \$72,052. He could then withdraw \$9,520 per year for the next 20 years. At the end of 17 years he will still have more on deposit than he invested originally.

Save Because NOTES

- You need a margin to replace necessary items, to pay cash for needs,
- For emergencies,
- To help others in need,
- To be available to God for ministry opportunities which cost money.

Have a Budget and Live Within It

We should make plans counting on God to direct us. Proverbs 16:9 (LB)

A good budget should follow this example:

If you are not in debt, the portion designated for payment of debts could be put into your giving or savings program.

It is important to have a budget because in our lifetimes we will all handle a small fortune.

Hoarding

God has blessed us with His resources. These resources are not only to provide for our needs, but also to help others in need and to build the Kingdom of God. It was never God's plan for us to hoard.

James warns that those who have hoarded their wealth will find misery coming upon them.

Come now, you rich, weep and howl for your miseries that are coming upon you! Your riches are cor-

rupted, and your garments are moth-eaten. Your gold and silver are corroded, and their corrosion will be a witness against you and will eat your flesh like fire. You have heaped up treasure in the last days. Indeed the wages of the laborers who mowed your fields, which you kept back by fraud, cry out; and the cries of the reapers have reached the ears of the Lord of Sabaoth.

James 5:1-4

The book of Proverbs tells us that hoarding does not necessarily guarantee wealth—in fact, it may accomplish the exact opposite.

There is one who scatters, yet increases more; and there is one who withholds more than is right, but it leads to poverty. The generous soul will be made rich, and he who waters will also be watered himself.

Proverbs 11:24,25



Jesus also spoke about the issue of hoarding and *warned* of God's judgment against it.

• Rich Young Ruler (Mark 10:17-22)

Jesus found this young man's weakness in the first commandment. The young man's possessions had become his god.

• The Rich Fool (Luke 12:16-21)

This man was not rich toward God—had no treasure in Heaven. He did not realize that his life would be required of him so soon.

• Rich Man and Lazarus (Luke 16:19-31)

Jesus said that if the rich men would not listen to the prophets and Moses, they would be closed also to one who rose from the dead.

These men all served two masters: **God** and **Possessions**. Their money was hoarded and not used to build God's Kingdom or to help those in need. Not only did they miss one of life's great blessings by refusing to give to others, but they also paid dearly for their greed.

Giving

The Bible teaches us that God is ever working to conform us to the image of His Son. Since the nature of God is **giving** and **generosity**, these attributes must become part of our nature as well. We must understand that:

• God is able to provide us with resources so that we are able to give.

And God is able to make all grace abound toward you, that you, always having all sufficiency in all things, have an abundance for every good work.

2 Corinthians 9:8

God Requires at Least a Tithe

The Old Testament guiding principle of a tithe should be a minimum for New Testament giving.

"Will a man rob God? Yet you have robbed Me! But you say, 'In what way have we robbed You?' In tithes and offerings. You are cursed with a curse, for you have robbed Me, even this whole nation. Bring all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be food in My house, and prove Me now in this," says the LORD of hosts, "If I will not open for you the windows of heaven and pour out for you such blessing that there will not be room enough to receive it. And I will rebuke the devourer for your sakes, so that he will not destroy the fruit of your ground, nor shall the vine fail to bear fruit for you in the field," says the LORD of hosts; "And all nations will call you blessed, for you will be a delightful land," says the LORD of hosts.

Malachi 3:8-12

From this passage note the following:

• Men often try to rob God by keeping the 10% tithe that God required of Old Testament Saints.

- People come to worship God in clothes and cars bought with money they have stolen from God.
- If people will give God His due portion, God will prove faithful to pour out blessings in far greater proportion than the tithe.

If God gives you \$10, one dollar belongs to Him. He will make your remaining \$9 go further than the original \$10 if you faithfully return to Him His portion.

Where to Give

In the Scripture we are taught to give in several instances or occasions:

Give to the Local Church

Bring all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be food in My house, and prove Me now in this," says the LORD of hosts, "If I will not open for you the windows of heaven And pour out for you such blessing That there will not be room enough to receive it."

Malachi 3:10

Give to People Who are Poor and Needy

If a brother or sister is naked and destitute of daily food, and one of you says to them, "Depart in peace, be warmed and filled," but you do not give them the things which are needed for the body, what does it profit?

James 2:15,16

Jesus said to him, "If you want to be perfect, go, sell what you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me."

Matthew 19:21

Give to Your Spiritual Teacher

Let him who is taught the word share in all good things with him who teaches.

Galatians 6:6

If *Equipping The Saints* has been a blessing to your life and growth, perhaps God would lead you to help us make these training tools

Blessings of Giving

God can give you more than you can ever need, so that you may always have sufficient for yourselves and enough left over to give to every good cause.

As the Scripture says:

He hath scattered abroad, he hath given to the poor, His righteousness abideth for ever.

He who gives the seed to the sower and bread to eat, will give you the seed of generosity to sow and will make it grow into a harvest of good deeds done.

The more you are enriched the more scope will there be for generous giving, and your gifts, administered through us, will mean that many will thank God.

For your giving does not end in meeting the wants of your fellow-Christians. It also results in an overflowing tide of thanksgiving to God.

Moreover, your very giving proves the real faith, and that means that men thank God that you practice the gospel of Christ that you profess to believe in, as well as for the actual gifts your fellowship makes to them and to others.

And yet further, men will pray for you and feel drawn to you because you have obviously received a generous measure of the grace of God.

Thank God, then, for his indescribable generosity to you!



A ONE YEAR BIBLE READING PROGRAM

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BIBLE READING PROGRAM

Introduction

The Bible is God's revealed Word to men. Therefore, it is of utmost importance to discover what it says and obey it!

Many Christians confine their Bible reading to certain favorite portions and only when they feel the need. But the Scriptures declare, "The whole Bible was given by inspiration from God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives; it straightens us out and helps us do what is right. It is God's way of making us well-prepared at every point, fully equipped to do good to everyone" (2 Timothy 3:16,17, Living Bible).

Want to know a secret of the Apostle Paul's dynamic, fruitful life? Listen to his testimony, "This is why we never collapse. The outward man does indeed suffer wear and tear, but everyday the inward man receives fresh strength" (2 Corinthians 4:16, Phillips). To keep spiritually fit we need the whole Bible, and we need to feed our souls from it daily.

Bible reading helps us know Jesus Christ better. We learn most about Jesus in the New Testament, particularly the Gospels, but He is actually the theme of the entire Book. After His resurrection Jesus astounded two of His disciples by beginning at Moses and all the prophets (the Old Testament) and interpreting to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself (see Luke 24:27). Look for Jesus Christ throughout the Bible.

People are groping for purpose and meaning to life. But we have undermined the very foundation for purposeful living by substituting God's truth with humanistic speculations. The result is more and more people confused, frustrated and in despair. How assuring are the words of Jesus to His Father, "Thy Word is truth!" Yes, the Book is true. And it is absolutely trustworthy. Men's theories undergo constant change, but the Bible needs no alteration. It is the most up-to-date Book there is. It is anchored in historical events and invites honest investigation. You can unreservedly place your confidence in it.

Develop the habit of regular, consecutive Bible reading and meditation and mark your growth in spiritual vitality, joy, stability and usefulness.

The Plan

- 1. You will read the New Testament in one year, and you can read the Old Testament either in one or two years.
- 2. Check the appropriate squares when you have read the specified portions. If you follow the one-year plan you will check both outside columns for the Old Testament, but only the left column in the shaded New Testament area.
- 3. Don't fall behind in your reading. If you miss a day continue to read according to date and as soon as possible make up the missed passages.
- 4. The Old Testament books are read in the order in which they appear in the Bible. If you follow the one-year plan, you will read in two sections of the Old Testament each day, beginning with Genesis and Ezra.
- 5. In keeping with the object of knowing Christ, the reading of the four Gospels is spaced throughout the year.
- 6. You will read an average of 54 verses a day for the two-year plan and 86 verses for the one-year plan.

Bible Reading Quiet Time Program

In Chapter Ten our lesson was the Quiet Time and its importance in learning how to develop our own personal relationship to the Lord. At that time we introduced you to a very simple 31-day Quiet Time program, called Appointment With God. This program guided you through a series of different ways, or patterns, you could use in addressing a passage of Scripture. Last week you completed the Appointment With God series.

In this lesson you are introduced to a Bible Reading Program which allows you to use these passages of Scripture to guide you in developing your relationship with God. These Bible Reading charts will take you through the entire Bible in one or *two years*.

If you do not have some other Quiet Time reading program you are following, let me encourage you to let the Bible Reading Program become your guide for Quiet Time passages.

Introduction

The Great Commission will never be accomplished until every disciple is "fishing for men." In this lesson we will be teaching you how to present the Gospel of Jesus Christ to another person. The tool we use is called the **Bridge** illustration. We use the Socratic form of evangelism in which people are given basic information and then asked specific questions based on the information. This has proven to be a very effective method of presenting the Gospel for a number of reasons:

- It creates a deductive dialogue.
- To answer the questions people must **reason** from the information given.
- The answer establishes the premises from which we continue to reason.
- People tell you what you wanted to tell them.
- People discover the truth on their own rather than by your giving them the answers.
- You have immediate feedback on what people do and don't understand.
- The truth is visualized as you write the answer into the illustration.


You are asked to memorize the following sequence of questions. You need not memorize word for word as you would memorize a Bible verse. However, if you adjust the questions, make sure that the question extracts the answer you want. A sloppy question may extract the wrong answer and hinder rather than help you. Memorize the sequence of questions in bold print. The logical answers are printed in script. Both are printed together so you can see the flow of thought for the dialogue.

Gospel Presentation

A person must understand three things to become a Child of God or, in other words, a Christian. With your permission, I would like to show you from the Bible what these three things are. Okay, if it doesn't take too long, I have a few minutes.

The First Thing

The Bible records that God made Adam and Eve and placed them in the Garden of Eden with clear instructions about the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil. They lived in perfect harmony with God and had fellowship with Him.



One day however, something happened in the Garden that caused a barrier to be erected between them and their Creator so that they could no longer have fellowship with Him.


Can you tell me what that was?

Was this when they ate the fruit and disobeyed God?


Yes, Adam and Eve chose to listen to the serpent's reasoning rather than God's command. There is a special word the Bible uses for this disobedience. Do you know what the Bible calls it?

Was it sin?

That's right-it was sin.



We could illustrate this another way; we could put man standing on one side of a cliff, God on the other side and SIN in between, separating them.



The Bible talks about this in Romans 3:23.

Would you please read this passage to me?

"For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."

According to this passage, how many have sinned?

It says "all."


Does this mean I have sinned?

It says "all," so I guess that means you.

Does it mean that you, too, have sinned?

Yes, it means that I, too, have sinned.

Now that's the first thing a man must understand to become a Christian. Let's write that down.



The Second Thing

The second thing that a man must understand to become a Christian is found in Romans 6:23. Here the author draws a conclusion to this matter of sin.

Would you please read this passage to me?

NOTES


"For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

God does not expect us to labor and make this world a better place to live without paying us a wage. God fully intends to pay us a wage for all that we have ever done.

However, here God says that the wage for our sin is what?

It says "death."

This is the second thing that a man must understand to become a Christian, so let's write that down.



We could say many things about death. But if we reduce it to its simplest form, it is mere separation. Several years ago, my father-in-law died. Now he is in one place and I am in another; death has separated us. When Adam and his wife sinned, they died spiritually and were separated from God.

The Third Thing

The third thing that a man must understand to become a Christian is found in Hebrews 9:27.


Would you please read this verse to me?

"And as it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment."

According to this verse, when a man dies he has an appointment with God, for what?

Judgment.

Since that is the third thing that a man must understand to become a Christian, let's write it down.




Now if it is true that all men have sinned, and that the penalty for sin is death and separation from God, and that the day is coming when man will be judged. This does not paint a very bright picture, does it?

No, it certainly does not.

Down through the ages, man has understood this and has tried to make his way back to God.

What are some ways you think men try to make their way back to God?

By living a good moral life? Being religious? Helping his fellow man?



You are right—this is how men try to make or work their way back to God. However, we learned in Romans 3:23 that all our efforts fall short of what God requires. In John 5:24, God reveals what is required. Here we learn three very interesting things that are relevant to what we have already learned.

I wonder if you would read this verse to me?

"Most assuredly, I say to you, he who hears My word and believes in Him who sent Me **has** everlasting life, and **shall** not come into judgment, but has **passed** from death into life."

Who's speaking?

I guess it's Jesus.

That's right-Jesus says that if you will hear His Words...

Are these my words or Jesus'?

Jesus'.

.And believe in Him who sent me...

Who sent Jesus?


God.

Three things would happen.

What are they?

- Has everlasting life
- Shall not face judgment
- ullet Passed from death to life

So let's write those down on the other side of the ravine.



Notice the tenses of the verbs in each of the above phrases.

In what tense is 'has"-past, future, or present?

Present tense.

What does the present tense in this statement mean?

It means that right now, in the present, I can have eternal life.

That's right. Now in what tense is "shall not"—present, past or future?

Future tense.

So what does this phrase mean?

I will not be judged at some future date.

That's right. Now in what tense is "passed" future, present or past?

Past tense.

And what does this phrase mean?


I have already passed from death into life.

That's right. It is important that you understand this because if you now have everlasting life, what does that do to death?

It crosses out death.

If you shall not be judged, what does that do to judgment?

It cancels judgment.



When I hear God calling and believe, that means:

- Intellectually I understand the facts of the Gospel;
- Emotionally I know and want to act on what I have heard;

• <u>Volitionally</u> I turn from man's side to God's side and place my faith in Jesus' finished work on the Cross for my sin.


This allows me to pass over to God's side. The Bible says:

God is on one side and all the people on the other; Jesus, Himself man, is between them to bring them together, by giving His life for all mankind.

1 Timothy 2:5 (LB)

For I delivered to you first of all that which I also received: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures...

1 Corinthians 15:3,4



If you were to place yourself into this illustration, where would you draw yourself?

I would place myself on man's side.

Is that where you want to be?

No.

Where do you want to be?

Over on God's side.

Do you know how to get there?

I'm not sure.

Let's look at John 1:12.

Will you read this verse to me?

"But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name."

What must a man do to become a Child of God?

He must receive "Him."

Must receive whom?

Jesus Christ.

Do you know how to receive Him?

I'm not sure.

Let's look at another verse in Revelation 3:20.

Will you read this to me?

"Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and dine with him, and he with Me."

Who is speaking?

Jesus.

What is He doing?

He is knocking at the door.

What door?

The door to man's heart and life.

Why is He knocking?

Because He wants to come in.

NOTES The way to receive Christ is to open the door of your heart and life and let Him in. To get from man's side to God's side, all you must do when we pray is repent of your sins, and ask God to do three things: • Forgive you for your sins. • Come into your life and help you to become the kind of person He created you to be. • Give you the gift of eternal life so that you might be with Him forever. I am going to ask you to pray these three things loud enough so that when you have finished I can say a prayer to God for you. Let's pray.

Introduction

Definition of Evaluation:

The examining of our objectives to see that every part of the predetermined plan is functioning according to the performance standard necessary for accomplishing the goal.

It is interesting to note that God has been involved in the process of evaluating his creation since the beginning of creation. The Genesis account records five times that the Lord evaluated the works of his hands—Genesis 1:4,12,19,21,26—and saw, "that it was good."

Then God saw everything that He had made, and indeed it was very good. So the evening and the morning were the sixth day.

Genesis 1:31

So each day, God evaluated His work and was pleased with what he saw; then on the sixth day He saw that is was *very* good.

Since the Psalmist knew this aspect about God, He encouraged the Lord to evaluate him so that God could make him the kind of man He desired.

The Bible says:

Search me, O God, and know my heart; try me, and know my anxieties; and see if there is any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting.

Psalms 139:23,24

Most people dislike evaluation—they see it as a negative rather than a positive contribution to their lives. When students are tested on their ability to grasp the material taught in the course, they groan in apprehension.

Some have even left the course to escape testing or evaluation. Evaluation, however, is not to be a negative process. It is constructive and designed to help us.

Evaluation helps us:

• Measure where we are in relationship to where we would be in reaching our goals.

If evaluation is to be a constructive process, it is helpful to be able to see the following:

Where I came from...
Where I am going...
Where I am now...

• Provide a basis and stimulus for needed correction.

If I have drifted off course or am not keeping pace with my stated progress, evaluation will stimulate me to take corrective action.

• Provide a base for future planning.


Knowing where we are at any given time will give us a basis on which to do our planning for the future. Evaluation is the way we find out where we are.

• Keep moving toward the goals.

Evaluation reveals deviation and keeps us moving in the right direction.

• Have a sane estimate of our abilities.

When we set unrealistic goals for ourselves, evaluation will reveal it. If we find that we are under pressure or overworked or just barely meeting our goals, our evaluation will help us to find a better balance or to set more realistic objectives.



NOTES

Objective vs. Subjective Evaluation

Evaluation should always be made on the basis of the stated goal or objective. If there is no clear goal stated, you are forced to evaluate **subjectively** and not **objectively**. In other words, you base your evaluation on your *emotional impression* of how you are doing in relation to the unmeasurable and nebulous goal. If the objective has been well-written, however, it will contain within itself a clear, concise measurable basis for evaluation.

Good objectives are not easy to write—they require some careful thought. But once they are written, they are easy to implement and measure because they state:

- The **inten**t of the objective,
- The **activity** required to accomplish the objective,
- The **plan** for accomplishing the objective,
- The basis for **evaluating** the objective.

Unfortunately, most Christians live by subjectives—they have no clear goals or objectives for their lives. They live from day to day, not sure where they are going. They are like a ship without rudders on the sea of life. They are driven by the winds and currents and do not understand that their lives are being dissipated by the temporal things of the world rather than being invested in eternal things of God. To suggest that they spend a half-day alone with God for evaluation would be of little value because they lack the direction necessary to evaluate.

How to Evaluate

Evaluation consists of asking a series of questions. These questions help you determine where you are going and how you are doing. The series of questions should be something like this:

What is my objective?

Review each objective for the following areas:

- My walk with God,
- My family,
- My vocation or studies,
- My ministry,

- My use of resources (time, money, talents),
- My overall life objective.

Are these objectives written in a clear, concise manner so that your

✓ Intent

✓ Activity

✓ Plan

✔ Progress

can be measured?

What is my present position in relation to my goal?

- Where am I?
- Where should I be?
- Am I on schedule?

The plan section of my stated objective studied in chapter 2/2 should help me at this point. It should spell out what I am doing and the amount of time necessary to keep me on target on a daily or weekly basis. If this part is well written, it will be easy for me to figure out where I am and if I am ahead, behind, or on schedule.

What obstacles are keeping me from my goal?

- What specific hindrances are keeping me from being where the plans call for me to be?
- Are you being honest at this point?
- Have you identified the **real** problem—not just a symptom or surface problem?

Oftentimes people will say, "This is my problem" when a large percentage of the time it really is not. It may only be a symptom. Unless you discover the root cause and remove it, you will never solve the problem.



NOTES

Suppose I hate roses, but had a rose bush in my garden. Would I ever get rid of the problem by cutting off every rose that appeared? By doing this I would only be pruning the bush and making it healthier. If I want to get *rid* of the bush, I need to get the shovel and remove it once and for all by attacking the root. The rose is the symptom, the root is the problem. Unfortunately many Christians are just pulling the roses off the bushes.

What corrections can I make to overcome the obstacles?

There may be several things that can be done to overcome a particular obstacle. List these options and then choose the best one for conquering the obstacle in a realistic way.

Sometimes we think there is only one solution to a problem. This is not always true. We ought to be able to find three to five possible solutions for every problem. If we can't, we probably are not really thinking. If we are going to overcome obstacles, we need to carefully think through the possibilities or we may find that a so-called solution has solved one problem but has now created two new ones!

What is my plan of action over the next three days/weeks/months?

Consider carefully this new corrective plan. Make sure it is **realistic**, **reasonable** and that it will **ensure success** in getting you back on target.

Determine some method of enforced discipline for yourself since you have not been holding this item in proper priority.

Make this a matter of special prayer. If you really want to be successful in accomplishing these worthwhile objectives, you **must** live by your plans and structured activities. If you do, rather than constantly being under the pressure and burden of unfulfilled goals, you will experience greater freedom and flexibility.

I suggest that if we are already experiencing victory in our objectives, evaluation once every three months should be sufficient. If we are struggling, we should increase the frequency of our evaluations to every three weeks. However, if we are simply defeated, we should not put off evaluation for more than three days. Not to take this corrective measure will ensure defeat and may cause us to lose hope and give up. Of course, this is exactly what Satan hopes will happen.

Remember that the successful man is willing to do what the unsuccessful man is *not* willing to do: namely, evaluating and enacting the necessary correction into his life.

Dangers in Evaluation Measure against yourself

 Make sure you measure yourself against your own objectives and abilities and not against other people or their objectives and abilities.

The Bible reminds us:

For we dare not class ourselves or compare ourselves with those who commend themselves. But they, measuring themselves by themselves, and comparing themselves among themselves, are not wise.

2 Corinthians 10:12

The Scriptures tell us that we are very unwise if we do this. If you take a person with an IQ of 130 (or a five-talent man as the Bible puts it) and ask him to perform at the same standard as the two-talent man with an IQ of 100, something is drastically wrong. Clearly, one man is far more capable than the other. One may be giving the job all he has while the other is only performing at a 70% capacity. Both men certainly do not deserve the same evaluation.

Do it now

• Don't postpone or avoid it.

Many wait too long to do their evaluating or even until it is too late. If you have a regular schedule, it will help you detect errors while they can still be corrected.

Remember:

Evaluation Is A Constructive Process

Designed To Help You Accomplish Your Desired Goal.

Nothing motivates people like success.

Evaluate objectively

If you don't have measurable objectives, don't waste your time trying to evaluate. Redeem the time by setting some measurable objectives so there will be something realistic to measure yourself by later.

In this lesson we are suggesting that you need to have clear objectives on at least 12 areas of your life. These areas will insure that the *wheel illustration* is a reality and not just a philosophy for your life. Begin now by filling out only the 12 objectives of your Personal Objectives and Evaluation Planner. At the end of Book 3 you will be asked to evaluate these 12 objectives.

People have many different ideas about love. However, these ideas often fall far short of the deep, rich qualities of love that we learn about in Scripture.





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BIBLE READING PROGRAM

Introduction

The Bible is God's revealed Word to men. Therefore, it is of utmost importance to discover what it says and obey it!

Many Christians confine their Bible reading to certain favorite portions and only when they feel the need. But the Scriptures declare, "The whole Bible was given by inspiration from God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives; it straightens us out and helps us do what is right. It is God's way of making us well-prepared at every point, fully equipped to do good to everyone" (2 Timothy 3:16,17, Living Bible).

Want to know a secret of the Apostle Paul's dynamic, fruitful life? Listen to his testimony, "This is why we never collapse. The outward man does indeed suffer wear and tear, but everyday the inward man receives fresh strength" (2 Corinthians 4:16, Phillips). To keep spiritually fit we need the whole Bible, and we need to feed our souls from it daily.

Bible reading helps us know Jesus Christ better. We learn most about Jesus in the New Testament, particularly the Gospels, but He is actually the theme of the entire Book. After His resurrection Jesus astounded two of His disciples by beginning at Moses and all the prophets (the Old Testament) and interpreting to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself (see Luke 24:27). Look for Jesus Christ throughout the Bible.

People are groping for purpose and meaning to life. But we have undermined the very foundation for purposeful living by substituting God's truth with humanistic speculations. The result is more and more people confused, frustrated and in despair. How assuring are the words of Jesus to His Father, "Thy Word is truth!" Yes, the Book is true. And it is absolutely trustworthy. Men's theories undergo constant change, but the Bible needs no alteration. It is the most up-to-date Book there is. It is anchored in historical events and invites honest investigation. You can unreservedly place your confidence in it.

Develop the habit of regular, consecutive Bible reading and meditation and mark your growth in spiritual vitality, joy, stability and usefulness.

The Plan

- 1. You will read the New Testament in one year, and you can read the Old Testament either in one or two years.
- 2. Check the appropriate squares when you have read the specified portions. If you follow the one-year plan you will check both outside columns for the Old Testament, but only the left column in the shaded New Testament area.
- 3. Don't fall behind in your reading. If you miss a day continue to read according to date and as soon as possible make up the missed passages.
- 4. The Old Testament books are read in the order in which they appear in the Bible. If you follow the one-year plan, you will read in two sections of the Old Testament each day, beginning with Genesis and Ezra.
- 5. In keeping with the object of knowing Christ, the reading of the four Gospels is spaced throughout the year.
- 6. You will read an average of 54 verses a day for the two-year plan and 86 verses for the one-year plan.

Bible Reading Quiet Time Program

In Chapter Ten our lesson was the Quiet Time and its importance in learning how to develop our own personal relationship to the Lord. At that time we introduced you to a very simple 31-day Quiet Time program, called Appointment With God. This program guided you through a series of different ways, or patterns, you could use in addressing a passage of Scripture. Last week you completed the Appointment With God series.

In this lesson you are introduced to a Bible Reading Program which allows you to use these passages of Scripture to guide you in developing your relationship with God. These Bible Reading charts will take you through the entire Bible in one or *two years*.

If you do not have some other Quiet Time reading program you are following, let me encourage you to let the Bible Reading Program become your guide for Quiet Time passages.

Come and see the place where he lay. [7] Then go quickly and tell his disciples: 'He has risen from the dead and is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him.' Now I have told you."

Matthew 28:11-15

While the women were on their way, some of the guards went into the city and reported to the chief priests everything that had happened. [12] When the chief priests had met with the elders and devised a plan, they gave the soldiers a large sum of money, [13] telling them, "You are to say, 'His disciples came during the night and stole him away while we were asleep.' [14] If this report gets to the governor, we will satisfy him and keep you out of trouble." [15] So the soldiers took the money and did as they were instructed. And this story has been widely circulated among the Jews to this very day.

So we make it our goal to please him, whether we are at home in the body or away from it. [10] For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive what is due him for the things done while in the body, whether good or bad.

[11] Since, then, we know what it is to fear the Lord, we try to persuade men. What we are is plain to God, and I hope it is also plain to your conscience. [12] We are not trying to commend ourselves to you again, but are giving you an opportunity to take pride in us, so that you can answer those who take pride in what is seen rather than in what is in the heart. [13] If we are out of our mind, it is for the sake of God; if we are in our right mind, it is for you. [14] For Christ's love compels us, because we are convinced that one died for all, and therefore all died.

1 Cor. 13:4-7

Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. [5] It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. [6] Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. [7] It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.

John 13:34-35

"A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. [35] By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

Then Agrippa said to Paul, "You have permission to speak for yourself." So Paul motioned with his hand and began his defense: [2] "King Agrippa, I consider myself fortunate to stand before you today as I make my defense against all the accusations of the Jews, [3] and especially so because you are well acquainted with all the Jewish customs and controversies. Therefore, I beg you to listen to me patiently.

- [4] "The Jews all know the way I have lived ever since I was a child, from the beginning of my life in my own country, and also in Jerusalem. [5] They have known me for a long time and can testify, if they are willing, that according to the strictest sect of our religion, I lived as a Pharisee. [6] And now it is because of my hope in what God has promised our fathers that I am on trial today. [7] This is the promise our twelve tribes are hoping to see fulfilled as they earnestly serve God day and night. O king, it is because of this hope that the Jews are accusing me. [8] Why should any of you consider it incredible that God raises the dead?
- [9] "I too was convinced that I ought to do all that was possible to oppose the name of Jesus of Nazareth. [10] And that is just what I did in Jerusalem. On the authority of the chief priests I put many of the saints in prison, and when they were put to death, I cast my vote against them. [11] Many a time I went from one synagogue to another to have them punished, and I tried to force them to blaspheme. In my obsession against them, I even went to foreign cities to persecute them.
- [12] "On one of these journeys I was going to Damascus with the authority and commission of the chief priests. [13] About noon, O king, as I was on the road, I saw a light from heaven, brighter than the sun, blazing around me and my companions. [14] We all fell to the ground, and I heard a voice saying to me in Aramaic, 'Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me? It is hard for you to kick against the goads.'
 - [15] "Then I asked, 'Who are you, Lord?"
- "'I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting,' the Lord replied. [16] 'Now get up and stand on your feet. I have appeared to you to appoint you as a servant and as a witness of what you have seen of me and what I will show you. [17] I will rescue you from your own people and from the Gentiles. I am sending you to them [18] to open their eyes and turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan to God, so that they may receive forgiveness of sins and a place among those who are sanctified by faith in me.'
- [19] "So then, King Agrippa, I was not disobedient to the vision from heaven. [20] First to those in Damascus, then to those in Jerusalem and in all Judea, and to the Gentiles also, I preached that they should repent and turn to God and prove their repentance by their deeds. [21] That is why the Jews seized me in the temple courts and tried to kill me. [22] But I have had God's help to this very day, and so I stand here and testify to small and great alike. I am saying nothing beyond what the

prophets and Moses said would happen-- [23] that the Christ would suffer and, as the first to rise from the dead, would proclaim light to his own people and to the Gentiles."

- [24] At this point Festus interrupted Paul's defense. "You are out of your mind, Paul!" he shouted. "Your great learning is driving you insane."
- [25] "I am not insane, most excellent Festus," Paul replied. "What I am saying is true and reasonable. [26] The king is familiar with these things, and I can speak freely to him. I am convinced that none of this has escaped his notice, because it was not done in a corner. [27] King Agrippa, do you believe the prophets? I know you do."
- [28] Then Agrippa said to Paul, "Do you think that in such a short time you can persuade me to be a Christian?"
- [29] Paul replied, "Short time or long--I pray God that not only you but all who are listening to me today may become what I am, except for these chains."

Book 2 Ch. 10

Ephes. 4:11-16

It was he who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers, [12] to prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up [13] until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.

[14] Then we will no longer be infants, tossed back and forth by the waves, and blown here and there by every wind of teaching and by the cunning and craftiness of men in their deceitful scheming. [16] From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work.

[4] For he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight. In love [5] he predestined us to be adopted as his sons through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will-- [6] to the praise of his glorious grace, which he has freely given us in the One he loves. [7] In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace [8] that he lavished on us with all wisdom and understanding. [9] And he made known to us the mystery of his will according to his good pleasure, which he purposed in Christ, [10] to be put into effect when the times will have reached their fulfillment --to bring all things in heaven and on earth together under one head, even Christ.
- [11] In him we were also chosen, having been predestined according to the plan of him who works out everything in conformity with the purpose of his will, [12] in order that we, who were the first to hope in Christ, might be for the praise of his glory. [13] And you also were included in Christ when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation. Having believed, you were marked in him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit, [14] who is a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance until the redemption of those who are God's possession--to the praise of his glory.
- [15] For this reason, ever since I heard about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all the saints, [16] I have not stopped giving thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers. [17] I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better. [18] I pray also that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, [19] and his incomparably great power for us who believe. That power is like the working of his mighty strength, [20] which he exerted in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly realms, [21] far above all rule and authority, power and dominion, and every title that can be given, not only in the present age but also in the one to come. [22] And God placed all things under his feet and appointed him to be head over everything for the church, [23] which is his body, the fullness of him who fills everything in every way.

Hebrews 11:1-40

Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see. [2] This is what the ancients were commended for.

- [3] By faith we understand that the universe was formed at God's command, so that what is seen was not made out of what was visible.
- [4] By faith Abel offered God a better sacrifice than Cain did. By faith he was commended as a righteous man, when God spoke well of his offerings. And by faith he still speaks, even though he is dead.
- [5] By faith Enoch was taken from this life, so that he did not experience death; he could not be found, because God had taken him away. For before he was taken, he was commended as one who pleased God. [6] And without faith it is impossible to

please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him.

- [7] By faith Noah, when warned about things not yet seen, in holy fear built an ark to save his family. By his faith he condemned the world and became heir of the righteousness that comes by faith.
- [8] By faith Abraham, when called to go to a place he would later receive as his inheritance, obeyed and went, even though he did not know where he was going. [9] By faith he made his home in the promised land like a stranger in a foreign country; he lived in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. [10] For he was looking forward to the city with foundations, whose architect and builder is God.
- [11] By faith Abraham, even though he was past age--and Sarah herself was barren--was enabled to become a father because he considered him faithful who had made the promise. [12] And so from this one man, and he as good as dead, came descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sand on the seashore.
- [13] All these people were still living by faith when they died. They did not receive the things promised; they only saw them and welcomed them from a distance. And they admitted that they were aliens and strangers on earth. [14] People who say such things show that they are looking for a country of their own. [15] If they had been thinking of the country they had left, they would have had opportunity to return. [16] Instead, they were longing for a better country—a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared a city for them.
- [17] By faith Abraham, when God tested him, offered Isaac as a sacrifice. He who had received the promises was about to sacrifice his one and only son, [18] even though God had said to him, "It is through Isaac that your offspring will be reckoned." [19] Abraham reasoned that God could raise the dead, and figuratively speaking, he did receive Isaac back from death.
 - [20] By faith Isaac blessed Jacob and Esau in regard to their future.
- [21] By faith Jacob, when he was dying, blessed each of Joseph's sons, and worshiped as he leaned on the top of his staff.
- [22] By faith Joseph, when his end was near, spoke about the exodus of the Israelites from Egypt and gave instructions about his bones.
- [23] By faith Moses' parents hid him for three months after he was born, because they saw he was no ordinary child, and they were not afraid of the king's edict.
- [24] By faith Moses, when he had grown up, refused to be known as the son of Pharaoh's daughter. [25] He chose to be mistreated along with the people of God rather than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a short time. [26] He regarded disgrace for the sake of Christ as of greater value than the treasures of Egypt, because he was looking ahead to his reward. [27] By faith he left Egypt, not fearing the king's anger; he persevered because he saw him who is invisible. [28] By faith he kept the Passover and the sprinkling of blood, so that the destroyer of the firstborn would not touch the firstborn of Israel.
- [29] By faith the people passed through the Red Sea as on dry land; but when the Egyptians tried to do so, they were drowned.

- [30] By faith the walls of Jericho fell, after the people had marched around them for seven days.
- [31] By faith the prostitute Rahab, because she welcomed the spies, was not killed with those who were disobedient.
- [32] And what more shall I say? I do not have time to tell about Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, David, Samuel and the prophets, [33] who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, and gained what was promised; who shut the mouths of lions, [34] quenched the fury of the flames, and escaped the edge of the sword; whose weakness was turned to strength; and who became powerful in battle and routed foreign armies. [35] Women received back their dead, raised to life again. Others were tortured and refused to be released, so that they might gain a better resurrection. [36] Some faced jeers and flogging, while still others were chained and put in prison. [37] They were stoned; they were sawed in two; they were put to death by the sword. They went about in sheepskins and goatskins, destitute, persecuted and mistreated-- [38] the world was not worthy of them. They wandered in deserts and mountains, and in caves and holes in the ground.
- [39] These were all commended for their faith, yet none of them received what had been promised. [40] God had planned something better for us so that only together with us would they be made perfect.

1 Kings 8:56

[3] Alarmed, Jehoshaphat resolved to inquire of the Lord, and he proclaimed a fast for all Judah. [4] The people of Judah came together to seek help from the Lord; indeed, they came from every town in Judah to seek him.
- [5] Then Jehoshaphat stood up in the assembly of Judah and Jerusalem at the temple of the Lord in the front of the new courtyard [6] and said:

"O Lord, God of our fathers, are you not the God who is in heaven? You rule over all the kingdoms of the nations. Power and might are in your hand, and no one can withstand you. [7] O our God, did you not drive out the inhabitants of this land before your people Israel and give it forever to the descendants of Abraham your

- friend? [8] They have lived in it and have built in it a sanctuary for your Name, saying, [9] 'If calamity comes upon us, whether the sword of judgment, or plague or famine, we will stand in your presence before this temple that bears your Name and will cry out to you in our distress, and you will hear us and save us.'
- [10] "But now here are men from Ammon, Moab and Mount Seir, whose territory you would not allow Israel to invade when they came from Egypt; so they turned away from them and did not destroy them. [11] See how they are repaying us by coming to drive us out of the possession you gave us as an inheritance. [12] O our God, will you not judge them? For we have no power to face this vast army that is attacking us. We do not know what to do, but our eyes are upon you."
- [13] All the men of Judah, with their wives and children and little ones, stood there before the Lord.
- [14] Then the Spirit of the Lord came upon Jahaziel son of Zechariah, the son of Benaiah, the son of Jeiel, the son of Mattaniah, a Levite and descendant of Asaph, as he stood in the assembly.
- [15] He said: "Listen, King Jehoshaphat and all who live in Judah and Jerusalem! This is what the Lord says to you: 'Do not be afraid or discouraged because of this vast army. For the battle is not yours, but God's. [16] Tomorrow march down against them. They will be climbing up by the Pass of Ziz, and you will find them at the end of the gorge in the Desert of Jeruel. [17] You will not have to fight this battle. Take up your positions; stand firm and see the deliverance the Lord will give you, O Judah and Jerusalem. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged. Go out to face them tomorrow, and the Lord will be with you.' "
- [18] Jehoshaphat bowed with his face to the ground, and all the people of Judah and Jerusalem fell down in worship before the Lord. [19] Then some Levites from the Kohathites and Korahites stood up and praised the Lord, the God of Israel, with very loud voice.
- [20] Early in the morning they left for the Desert of Tekoa. As they set out, Jehoshaphat stood and said, "Listen to me, Judah and people of Jerusalem! Have faith in the Lord your God and you will be upheld; have faith in his prophets and you will be successful." [21] After consulting the people, Jehoshaphat appointed men to sing to the Lord and to praise him for the splendor of his holiness as they went out at the head of the army, saying:

"Give thanks to the Lord, for his love endures forever."

- [22] As they began to sing and praise, the Lord set ambushes against the men of Ammon and Moab and Mount Seir who were invading Judah, and they were defeated. [23] The men of Ammon and Moab rose up against the men from Mount Seir to destroy and annihilate them. After they finished slaughtering the men from Seir, they helped to destroy one another.
- [24] When the men of Judah came to the place that overlooks the desert and looked toward the vast army, they saw only dead bodies lying on the ground; no one had escaped. [25] So Jehoshaphat and his men went to carry off their plunder, and

they found among them a great amount of equipment and clothing and also articles of value--more than they could take away. There was so much plunder that it took three days to collect it. [26] On the fourth day they assembled in the Valley of Beracah, where they praised the Lord. This is why it is called the Valley of Beracah to this day.

[27] Then, led by Jehoshaphat, all the men of Judah and Jerusalem returned joyfully to Jerusalem, for the Lord had given them cause to rejoice over their enemies. [28] They entered Jerusalem and went to the temple of the Lord with harps and lutes and trumpets.

[29] The fear of God came upon all the kingdoms of the countries when they heard how the Lord had fought against the enemies of Israel. [30] And the kingdom of Jehoshaphat was at peace, for his God had given him rest on every side.

- [12] When he had finished washing their feet, he put on his clothes and returned to his place. "Do you understand what I have done for you?" he asked them. [13]

- [9] Instruct a wise man and he will be wiser still; teach a righteous man and he will add to his learning.
- [10] "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom, and knowledge of the Holy One is understanding.
- [11] For through me your days will be many,

and years will be added to your life.
[12] If you are wise, your wisdom will reward you;

if you are a mocker, you alone will suffer."

- [13] The woman Folly is loud; she is undisciplined and without knowledge.
- [14] She sits at the door of her house, on a seat at the highest point of the city,
- [15] calling out to those who pass by, who go straight on their way.
- [16] "Let all who are simple come in here!" she says to those who lack judgment.
- [17] "Stolen water is sweet; food eaten in secret is delicious!"
- [18] But little do they know that the dead are there, that her guests are in the depths of the grave.

Proverbs 10:1-32

The proverbs of Solomon:

- A wise son brings joy to his father, but a foolish son grief to his mother.
- [2] Ill-gotten treasures are of no value, but righteousness delivers from death.
- [3] The Lord does not let the righteous go hungry but he thwarts the craving of the wicked.
- [4] Lazy hands make a man poor, but diligent hands bring wealth.
- [5] He who gathers crops in summer is a wise son, but he who sleeps during harvest is a disgraceful son.
- [6] Blessings crown the head of the righteous, but violence overwhelms the mouth of the wicked.
- [7] The memory of the righteous will be a blessing, but the name of the wicked will rot.
- [8] The wise in heart accept commands, but a chattering fool comes to ruin.
- [9] The man of integrity walks securely,

but he who takes crooked paths will be found out.

- [10] He who winks maliciously causes grief, and a chattering fool comes to ruin.
- [11] The mouth of the righteous is a fountain of life, but violence overwhelms the mouth of the wicked.
- [12] Hatred stirs up dissension, but love covers over all wrongs.
- [13] Wisdom is found on the lips of the discerning, but a rod is for the back of him who lacks judgment.
- [14] Wise men store up knowledge, but the mouth of a fool invites ruin.
- [15] The wealth of the rich is their fortified city, but poverty is the ruin of the poor.
- [16] The wages of the righteous bring them life, but the income of the wicked brings them punishment.
- [17] He who heeds discipline shows the way to life, but whoever ignores correction leads others astray.
- [18] He who conceals his hatred has lying lips, and whoever spreads slander is a fool.
- [19] When words are many, sin is not absent, but he who holds his tongue is wise.
- [20] The tongue of the righteous is choice silver, but the heart of the wicked is of little value.
- [21] The lips of the righteous nourish many, but fools die for lack of judgment.
- [22] The blessing of the Lord brings wealth, and he adds no trouble to it.
- [23] A fool finds pleasure in evil conduct, but a man of understanding delights in wisdom.
- [24] What the wicked dreads will overtake him; what the righteous desire will be granted.

- [25] When the storm has swept by, the wicked are gone, but the righteous stand firm forever.
- [26] As vinegar to the teeth and smoke to the eyes, so is a sluggard to those who send him.
- [27] The fear of the Lord adds length to life, but the years of the wicked are cut short.
- [28] The prospect of the righteous is joy, but the hopes of the wicked come to nothing.
- [29] The way of the Lord is a refuge for the righteous, but it is the ruin of those who do evil.
- [30] The righteous will never be uprooted, but the wicked will not remain in the land.
- [31] The mouth of the righteous brings forth wisdom, but a perverse tongue will be cut out.
- [32] The lips of the righteous know what is fitting, but the mouth of the wicked only what is perverse.

Proverbs 19:1-29

Better a poor man whose walk is blameless than a fool whose lips are perverse.

- [2] It is not good to have zeal without knowledge, nor to be hasty and miss the way.
- [3] A man's own folly ruins his life, yet his heart rages against the Lord.
- [4] Wealth brings many friends, but a poor man's friend deserts him.
- [5] A false witness will not go unpunished, and he who pours out lies will not go free.
- [6] Many curry favor with a ruler, and everyone is the friend of a man who gives gifts.

- [7] A poor man is shunned by all his relatives-how much more do his friends avoid him!

 Though he pursues them with pleading, they are nowhere to be found.
- [8] He who gets wisdom loves his own soul; he who cherishes understanding prospers.
- [9] A false witness will not go unpunished, and he who pours out lies will perish.
- [10] It is not fitting for a fool to live in luxury -- how much worse for a slave to rule over princes!
- [11] A man's wisdom gives him patience; it is to his glory to overlook an offense.
- [12] A king's rage is like the roar of a lion, but his favor is like dew on the grass.
- [13] A foolish son is his father's ruin, and a quarrelsome wife is like a constant dripping.
- [14] Houses and wealth are inherited from parents, but a prudent wife is from the Lord.
- [15] Laziness brings on deep sleep, and the shiftless man goes hungry.
- [16] He who obeys instructions guards his life, but he who is contemptuous of his ways will die.
- [17] He who is kind to the poor lends to the Lord, and he will reward him for what he has done.
- [18] Discipline your son, for in that there is hope; do not be a willing party to his death.
- [19] A hot-tempered man must pay the penalty; if you rescue him, you will have to do it again.
- [20] Listen to advice and accept instruction, and in the end you will be wise.
- [21] Many are the plans in a man's heart, but it is the Lord's purpose that prevails.

- [22] What a man desires is unfailing love; better to be poor than a liar.
- [23] The fear of the Lord leads to life: Then one rests content, untouched by trouble.
- [24] The sluggard buries his hand in the dish; he will not even bring it back to his mouth!
- [25] Flog a mocker, and the simple will learn prudence; rebuke a discerning man, and he will gain knowledge.
- [26] He who robs his father and drives out his mother is a son who brings shame and disgrace.
- [27] Stop listening to instruction, my son, and you will stray from the words of knowledge.
- [28] A corrupt witness mocks at justice, and the mouth of the wicked gulps down evil.
- [29] Penalties are prepared for mockers, and beatings for the backs of fools.

Proverbs 20:1-30

Wine is a mocker and beer a brawler; whoever is led astray by them is not wise.

- [2] A king's wrath is like the roar of a lion; he who angers him forfeits his life.
- [3] It is to a man's honor to avoid strife, but every fool is quick to quarrel.
- [4] A sluggard does not plow in season; so at harvest time he looks but finds nothing.
- [5] The purposes of a man's heart are deep waters, but a man of understanding draws them out.
- [6] Many a man claims to have unfailing love, but a faithful man who can find?
- [7] The righteous man leads a blameless life;

- blessed are his children after him.
- [8] When a king sits on his throne to judge, he winnows out all evil with his eyes.
- [9] Who can say, "I have kept my heart pure; I am clean and without sin"?
- [10] Differing weights and differing measuresthe Lord detests them both.
- [11] Even a child is known by his actions, by whether his conduct is pure and right.
- [12] Ears that hear and eyes that seethe Lord has made them both.
- [13] Do not love sleep or you will grow poor; stay awake and you will have food to spare.
- [14] "It's no good, it's no good!" says the buyer; then off he goes and boasts about his purchase.
- [15] Gold there is, and rubies in abundance, but lips that speak knowledge are a rare jewel.
- [16] Take the garment of one who puts up security for a stranger; hold it in pledge if he does it for a wayward woman.
- [17] Food gained by fraud tastes sweet to a man, but he ends up with a mouth full of gravel.
- [18] Make plans by seeking advice; if you wage war, obtain guidance.
- [19] A gossip betrays a confidence; so avoid a man who talks too much.
- [20] If a man curses his father or mother, his lamp will be snuffed out in pitch darkness.
- [21] An inheritance quickly gained at the beginning will not be blessed at the end.
- [22] Do not say, "I'll pay you back for this wrong!" Wait for the Lord, and he will deliver you.

- [23] The Lord detests differing weights, and dishonest scales do not please him.
- [24] A man's steps are directed by the Lord. How then can anyone understand his own way?
- [25] It is a trap for a man to dedicate something rashly and only later to consider his vows.
- [26] A wise king winnows out the wicked; he drives the threshing wheel over them.
- [27] The lamp of the Lord searches the spirit of a man; it searches out his inmost being.
- [28] Love and faithfulness keep a king safe; through love his throne is made secure.
- [29] The glory of young men is their strength, gray hair the splendor of the old.
- [30] Blows and wounds cleanse away evil, and beatings purge the inmost being.

James 3:13-18

Who is wise and understanding among you? Let him show it by his good life, by deeds done in the humility that comes from wisdom. [14] But if you harbor bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not boast about it or deny the truth. [15] Such "wisdom" does not come down from heaven but is earthly, unspiritual, of the devil. [16] For where you have envy and selfish ambition, there you find disorder and every evil practice.

[17] But the wisdom that comes from heaven is first of all pure; then peace-loving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy and good fruit, impartial and sincere. [18] Peacemakers who sow in peace raise a harvest of righteousness.

[10] I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the fellowship of sharing in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, [11] and so, somehow, to attain to the resurrection from the dead.

[12] Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already been made perfect, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me. [13] Brothers, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, [14] I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus.
